Technician Trainee Program



Since Fall 2018, Tesla has worked closely with the University of Nevada,
Reno's College of Engineering to identify and recruit students for the Technician
Trainee Program. This year, 10 trainees from the school were selected to
become part-time employees at Gigafactory Nevada.

With adjusted schedules, these part-time working students receive hands-on experience in engineering, robotics and automation. At the end of their first 90

days, the students will undergo a review for potential internship opportunities and full-time conversion — or even an extension of their existing 90-day assignment.

In 2017, Tesla partnered with the Governor's Office of Economic Development, Truckee Meadows Community College, and Western Nevada College to create the Gateway Scholarship Program - a workforce development initiative for Nevadans to level-up their skillsets in advanced manufacturing through a 15-credit employment credential. Since the creation of this program, we've seen over 500 Nevadans take coursework to accelerate their career, and over 60 team members at Tesla have fully completed the program. Here are some of their stories:

George Stewart was the first individual to finish this program in 2018.
 Following his completion, George has been promoted multiple times and is now an Associate Process Engineer that has mentored other team members throughout the program.

- Avery Washington demonstrated a unique technical aptitude and incredible dedication, finishing the program faster than anyone at Tesla and has recently moved into a Maintenance Technician role focusing on Model 3 production.
- Sarielyann Yaeger was recognized by Truckee Meadows Community
 College for her dedication and leadership in the classroom to support her
 peers. Sarielyann became one of the first females to complete the
 program, and has become a leader on Tesla's energy production team in
 her new role as a process engineering technician since completing the
 program.
