

2018 WSPTA Legislative Assembly Voting Delegate Information

Who can be a delegate?

- Voting credentials are issued to voting delegates who have registered for legislative assembly and paid the registration fee established by the WSPTA board of directors.
- Local PTA voting delegates must be in PT Avenue as paid **2018-2019** members of the local PTA they represent. Council voting delegates must be in PT Avenue as paid **2018-2019** members of a local PTA in the council they represent. Delegates register for legislative assembly under the member ID associated with this local PTA paid membership.
- Delegates may only vote on behalf of one local PTA or council – the local PTA under which they have registered for legislative assembly, or its council.
- Voting credentials are non-transferable.
- The method for selecting voting delegates and alternates should be specified in a local PTA or council's standing rules.
- The president of a local PTA or council must notify WSPTA of the names of their voting delegates no later than midnight on October 12, 2018.
- Local PTAs in good standing have voting delegates determined by the number of paid members at the end of the previous fiscal year. PTAs with up to 200 members are entitled to four voting delegates; one additional delegate may be added for each additional 100 members.
- Each council in good standing is entitled to have four voting delegates at legislative assembly.
- New local PTAs and councils chartered after June 30 of the previous year are allowed delegates based on the membership number recorded in the WSPTA office 15 days prior to legislative assembly.

What will be voted on?

At the 2018 WSPTA Legislative Assembly, delegates will vote on adoption of the agenda and standing rules, and on the new 2018-2020 WSPTA legislative platform. There are several proposed long-term resolutions, principles and short-term legislative issues for consideration and vote.

When will delegates vote?

Delegates will vote at various times throughout the weekend: Saturday morning and late afternoon, and Sunday morning, noon, and late afternoon.
