Why do we do the Count?

Why is it conducted every year?

To consistently measure our needs and progress toward ending homelessness.

How will I know what to do that night?

You will be fully trained and provided with the materials you'll need upon arrival.

How old do I have to be?

Volunteers conducting the count must be 18+ to participate.
