

Timothy C. Forbes

Timothy C. Forbes, Founding Chair of HHT, is President of Highlander Management. Previously he was Chief Operating Officer of Forbes Media and Chairman of Forbes.com. Mr. Forbes joined the company in 1986 after negotiating the acquisition of the *American Heritage* division. Prior to joining Forbes, he was an independent producer and screenwriter; his documentaries on historical subjects and current affairs have been broadcast nationally on PBS. He served on HHT's Board of Directors from 1989 to 2014 and as Chair from 1989 to 1994.

Cynthia C. Wainwright

Cynthia C. Wainwright has worked passionately to preserve and interpret New York's history, safeguard and enhance its parks and natural areas, and make government more responsible and efficient. She serves on the Boards of Directors of The Bridge, The Churchill School, the Children's Museum of the Arts, and the Roundabout Theatre Company. Wainwright is a founding trustee of HHT and has served on the Board of Directors from 1989 to present, acting as Chair from 1994 to 1997.

Robert C. Quinlan

Robert C. Quinlan has been a real estate investor and developer in the tri-state area since 1971. In that time he has developed or renovated over 22 buildings and maintains ownership in 33 properties. Mr. Quinlan dedicates himself to the preservation of historic buildings and open space. He has served on the Boards of Directors of Friends of the Upper East Side Historic Districts, the New York Landmarks Conservancy, and the Preservation League of New York State. He and his wife Encarnita have also established a nature preserve in western Puerto Rico. Mr. Quinlan served on HHT's Board of Directors from 1991 to 2005 and acted as Chair from 1997 to 2000. Since 2005 he has been a member of HHT's Directors' Council.

Deborah Krulewitch

Deborah Krulewitch is a founding trustee of the Historic House Trust and has served on the Board of Directors from 1989 to present. As Executive Director of the Gracie Mansion Conservancy, Ms. Krulewitch spearheaded the restoration of the mansion under Mayor Ed Koch. This restoration helped to inspire the creation of HHT. She retired as the Senior Vice President of Corporate Administration at the Estée Lauder Companies, and continues to consult for the Lauder Family on various philanthropic initiatives. She serves on the Boards of Directors for the Breast Cancer Research Foundation, Publicolor (Emerita), and the Coalition for the Homeless First Step Program. She served as Chair of HHT from 2000 to 2006 and as Co-Chair alongside Franny Eberhart from 2006 to 2009.

Franny Eberhart

Franny Eberhart's first preservation effort was the restoration of the Church of the Holy Trinity on New York City's Upper East Side. From there, she attended Columbia University's Historic Preservation program and has since dedicated years of service to New York's leading preservation organizations, including the New York Landmarks Conservancy, the Historic Districts Council, and the Municipal Art Society of New York. She currently acts as President of Friends of the Upper East Side Historic Districts. She has served on HHT's Board of Directors from 1999 to present, including as Co-Chair alongside Deborah Krulewitch from 2006 to 2009 and as Chair from 2009 to 2012.

John C. Gustafsson

John C. Gustafsson is a retired lawyer with two decades of experience in private practice and two decades of experience in nonprofit leadership and governance. He currently serves on the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of Devereux Advanced Behavioral Health and is the founding chair of Devereux' New York City Advisory Board. He chairs the Finance Council at St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church (Staten Island) where he is Secretary of the Holy Name Society. Mr. Gustafsson is also the former President and Chairman of the Board of the Staten Island Historical Society, and has consulted for dozens of other nonprofits over the course of his career. He has served on HHT's Board of Directors from 2008 to present, including as Vice Chair from 2009 to 2012 and as Chair from 2012 to 2018.

Myra Biblowit

Myra Biblowit is President and CEO of the Breast Cancer Research Foundation (BCRF), the largest private funder of breast cancer research worldwide. Prior to joining BCRF, Ms. Biblowit was Vice Dean for External Affairs at NYU Medical Center and Senior Vice President of the Mount Sinai-NYU Health System. Previously, she served as Senior Vice President and Executive Director of the Capital Campaign at the American Museum of Natural History. Earlier, Myra served as Executive Vice President of the Central Park Conservancy. Ms. Biblowit is also a Director of Wyndham Hotels and Resorts and serves on the boards of Project Hope for Ovarian Cancer Research and the Housewares Charity Foundation. She is a founding trustee of the Historic House Trust and has served on the Board of Directors from 1989 to present.

Adrian Benepe

Adrian Benepe is Senior Vice President and Director of National Programs for The Trust for Public Land. One of the nation's experts on the nexus of the public, private, and nonprofit sectors in public-space development and management, Mr. Benepe has held positions at the Municipal Art Society of New York and the New York Botanical Garden, and served as New York City Parks Commissioner for 11 years under Mayor Michael Bloomberg. During his role as Commissioner he oversaw a major expansion of the city's park system, including restoring Central Park and Battery Park. He also helped to create several conservancies and organizations, including the Historic House Trust in 1989.
