Pregnancy is a stressful time for both parents-to-be, and it was no different for Destiny and Darius. However, Darius violently took his frustrations out on Destiny. The fact that she was pregnant did not save her from her husband's abuse.

*One in six pregnant women has been abused by her partner. The stress of pregnancy might be unavoidable, but it's **not** okay for a partner to resort to violence.*
