Senate bills passed and messaged

[SB-007](#) (Sen. Andre Jacque) – Barring foreign adversaries from purchasing agricultural or forestry land in Wisconsin.

[SB-036](#) (Sen. Andre Jacque) – Creating a state income tax exemption for employee cash tips.

[SB-069](#) (Sen. Dan Feyen) – Allowing teachers to claim an income tax subtraction for specified job-related expenses.

[SB-181](#) (Sen. Howard Marklein) – Providing a levy limit exception for regional EMS systems and establishing eligibility for the expenditure restraint incentive program.

[SB-191](#) (Sen. Jesse James) – Requiring subpoenas for law enforcement officers, served in their official capacity, to be delivered to their workplace address.
