On Thursday, Governor Newsom issued a stay-at-home order for the State of California. Residents can still leave their homes for work if they are employed or operate in a critical infrastructure sector or to access essential services. This information and more can be found on the state's new, consumer-friendly website, <a href="www.covid19.ca.gov">www.covid19.ca.gov</a>. The critical infrastructure information can be found here: <a href="https://www.cisa.gov/identifying-critical-infrastructure-during-covid-19">https://www.cisa.gov/identifying-critical-infrastructure-during-covid-19</a>. At this point, the State of California does not have any access and/or re-entry waivers or protocols or permits required. Some California counties have taken it upon their authority to check drivers to make sure they are allowed to travel. In this case, we recommend carrying a letter (on company letterhead) stating employment and that they are essential with a reference to Governor's Executive Order and the related Executive Order (<a href="https://covid19.ca.gov/img/Executive-Order-N-33-20.pdf">https://covid19.ca.gov/img/Executive-Order-N-33-20.pdf</a>) – and let your employees know to carry a photo ID (driver's license).
