Camp Guidelines

In the interest of safety and community, the following guidelines will be enforced. Thank you for your cooperation with these expectations.

- 1. Campers under 18 are not to leave the campgrounds without parent/sponsor permission, and after 7:00 p.m. only if accompanied by a parent/sponsor.
- 2. Campers are not to ride bicycles after dark.
- 3. Campers are not to use bikes or skateboards on the Pavilion bridge or patio.
- 4. Parents and guardians are to ensure that children and youth are not together in private quarters without adult supervision.
- 5. Fighting, profanity, firearms (except for ceremonial purposes), fireworks, and the use of tobacco (including vaping), alcohol or illegal drugs, are not allowed at the camp.
- 6. Modesty and good taste in personal attire are expected while on the grounds. Shoes and shirts are required in the dining hall and the Pavilion.
- 7. Pavilion showers are not to be used thirty minutes prior to or during services.
- 8. Campers are to attend the evening worship services. Those under the age of 18 are to attend youth or children's services, as age would dictate.
- 9. For the comfort of our campers, quiet hour begins at 11 p.m. or one half hour following the last scheduled activity.
- 10. All pets on the campground must be confined or leashed. Campers are to promptly care for pet waste. Pets are not allowed in Indiana, Illinois, Bethany House, Heritage Lodge, Wesley Inn or common buildings.
- 11. Disposal service requires that refuse be placed in plastic bags before depositing in the dumpers.
- 12. Motorized vehicles such as 4-wheelers are not allowed. Golf carts are welcomed for necessary transportation.
