The O Antiphons

Most familiar today from the Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," the seven traditional "O Antiphons" are actually more than a thousand years old. They have long been used at the very end of Advent (Dec. 17-23) in the liturgical prayer of the Church. Each Antiphon invokes the coming of the Messiah, beginning with a biblical title and closing with a specific petition. In the traditional arrangement, when viewed from Christmas Eve backward, the first letters of the Latin texts

(Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix , Adonai, Sapientia) spell out the phrase *ero cras* ("I come tomorrow").

#### December 17 – O Sapientia

English: O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from one end to the other, mightily and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

#### December 18 – O Adonai

English: O Adonai, and leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

#### December 19 – O Radix Jesse

English: O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings will shut their mouths, to you the nations will make their prayer: Come and deliver us, and delay no longer.

#### December 20 – O Clavis David

English: O Key of David and scepter of

the House of Israel; you open and no one can shut; you shut and no one can open: Come and lead the prisoners from the prison house, those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

#### December 21 – O Oriens

English: O Morning Star, splendor of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

#### December 22 – O Rex Gentium

English: O King of the nations, and their desire, the cornerstone making both one: Come and save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

#### December 23 – O Emmanuel

English: O Emmanuel, our king and our lawgiver, the hope of the nations and their Savior: Come and save us, O Lord our God.
