Dear Xavier Family-

As parents, you probably feel challenged to keep up in this ever-changing age in any number of ways. Try to find your child's favorite musical artist only to discover that the spelling of the name makes no sense. (I thought we had lots of compassionate high schoolers who loved infants, and then I discovered they were deferring to DaBaby). Keep yourself composed as they tell you that their goal is to be a creator. "An inventor?" you ask hopefully. Watch their disbelieving face when they correct you - "No, a content creator. A TikTok sensation. Someone with influence." Suggest reading a book during some free time and be prepared to be treated as if you advised them to whittle their own canoe to use while hunting and gathering the banks of the Fox River. The world of a teenager can seem altogether different from the world of an adult. Despite the challenges in keeping up, we know that some things are timeless.

Young people want to be loved and supported. They are social creatures. That's one of the things that has made the last 18 months so challenging - it goes against their nature to be distant, to be isolated. For all of its virtue and vice, social media has allowed our students to overcome the burdens of distance and quarantine to stay in communication. Today, relationships are built by sharing and liking, but not in the ways that our kindergarten teachers expected. Students are challenged with forming a healthy worldview, fostering positive mental health for themselves and others, and learning how to be who God made them to be. Most of that challenge happens now in the realm of social media. We must do everything in our power to help them to learn how to be digital citizens, to use the technological tools for the benefit of the world, and to prepare them for college and career by keeping social media in its proper place and balance.

In October, our school theme is "Using Social Media to Advance God's Kingdom." We are blessed to welcome Dr. Justin Patchin to address the Xavier community. On October 27, he will be speaking to our high school students in the morning and our middle school students in the afternoon. Dr. Patchin is a national expert on the topics of cyberbullying and social media. He has published numerous articles and spoken to groups of all sizes on these critical issues. We look forward to his presentation and the discussions at school and home that are certain to follow.

As this opportunity is particularly relevant at this time, we have also arranged for a special parent session at 6:30 PM on Wednesday, October 27. Parents of Xavier students as well as parents from the community at large are invited to join us to hear Dr. Patchin and ask questions of him. We hope that you can join us. Bring your fellow parents as well. Let's do what we can to bridge the communication and understanding gap in our digital world!

AP Testing Sign Up

Students interested in taking an AP test must register **AND** make a payment no later than Monday, November 11. This information can be found on the Xavier Counseling Website. Each AP test costs \$96. Students can either pay with cash/check or have the fee applied to their Smart Tuition account. Late registration will cost an additional \$55. If a student decides not to take the test, a refund of \$56 will be made (cost minus the ordering cost of \$40).

Students who received accommodations for the PLAN, ACT or SAT must see Mr. Neiswender immediately to discuss possible accommodations for AP testing. The deadline to apply for accommodations is January 2022. If you have any questions regarding AP testing, please see your AP teacher or talk with Mrs. Schuh.

Testing Day

Tuesday, Oct 19, 2021, 8:00am - 11:30am

What happens on Test Day?

<u>Freshmen and sophomores</u> will take the preACT -- a practice ACT designed for 9th and 10th graders. This test will be given at no cost to all freshmen and sophomores. No prep is needed. Details will be provided in the coming weeks.

<u>Juniors</u> will have the opportunity to take the ACT (no writing) at Xavier High School. Xavier is offering this optional ACT so that our juniors have one ACT that is guaranteed to occur despite potential COVID-related limits at other ACT test sites. We have heard of no upcoming closures at national test sites, so juniors may certainly wait until later in the year to take the ACT. Scores from this October 19 test can be used for college applications. A test prep class will be offered especially for this test date.

<u>Seniors</u> may also take the October 19 ACT at Xavier, if they wish. If they do not take the ACT, they should work on other college-related activities that morning, such as their applications and essays.

Youth Risk Behavior Survey

Our school is taking part in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey sponsored by the Department of Public Instruction. The survey will ask about health behaviors that keep young people healthy, as well as behaviors that result in unintentional and intentional injuries, tobacco use, and alcohol and other drug use. It will also ask about bullying, sexual risk behaviors (mostly for high school students), online risk behaviors, stress and anxiety, self-harm, dietary behavior and physical activity. It also focuses on positive things like strong connections to the school and to other people.

Students will be asked to fill out an anonymous, online questionnaire that takes about 25-35 minutes to complete. They will take the survey during regular class time.

The survey has been designed to protect your child's privacy. Students will not put their names on the survey and it does not ask for student IDs or any other individual identifiers. The classroom setting will be set up like a test so that students' answers remain private. The school will not have access to individual students' answers and no class or student will ever be mentioned by name in a report of the results. Your child will get no benefit right away from taking part in the survey. However, the results of this survey do help students by providing schools and the community with information that is used to improve health and safety programs. We would like all students to take part in the survey, but the survey is voluntary. No action will be taken against you, or your child, if your child does not take part. Students can skip any question that they do not wish to answer. In addition, students may stop participating in the survey at any point without penalty.
