But, it was just one year ago, on St. Patrick's Day that we were on what would be our last day of school before being closed for the rest of the school year.

A whole lot has happened since then. Thanks to our amazing tech team, we have been able to maneuver through all of the virtual learning last spring, as well as meeting the needs of classes this year when they needed to quarantine due to close contacts. We have become familiar with new cleaning protocols and health guidelines. But most of all, we have been extremely grateful for the opportunity to be together this school year.

Like all of you, I am looking forward to the freedom afforded by the vaccines—and am hoping that we will soon be able to return to a more normal way of life. #### **Vision Screening**

On March 29th, we will be having our yearly vision screening for preschool through 2nd grade along with older students who are new to our school. These will be provided by the Noon Lions Club. Parents with children in 3rd and 4th grade are welcome to request a screening for their child, even though their classes will not be scheduled to go as a group.

This screening consists of taking a quick picture of the eye to screen for vision issues that may need further evaluation. To effectively address vision issues in children, Spot, a revolutionary automated vision screening technology has been developed to quickly detect the most common treatable sight threatening conditions in children, such as:

- Refractive errors (nearsightedness, unequal power and astigmatism)
- Amblyopia (lazy eye)
- Strabismus (crossed eyes)
- Anisometropia (comparative analysis for unequal refractive power)
- Anisocoria (unequal pupil size)

This vision screening <u>does</u> not replace a full eye exam, but will help you know if you should schedule one for your child. NOTE: Parents will only receive a notice if something was detected by the screening.

## **Pop Tab Contest**

Each year we hold a contest to see which class can bring in the most pop tabs. The aluminum that is collected is donated to the Ronald McDonald House Charities.
