Dear Xavier Family,

A few weeks ago, I was at Saturday evening Mass at St. Joseph's and the Gospel was the famous story of the feeding of the 5000. Father Jim was making the point that such an incredible happening took place because of the love of Jesus and the faith of a young boy. As Father continued his homily, my mind wandered (sorry, Father Jim!) to just how true that observation was. I started to think of all of Jesus's miracles and the reality that each miracle came about when the power of God mixed with the faith of an ordinary person. Lepers are cleansed because they recognize Jesus. Lazarus is raised after his sisters express their confidence in Jesus. What makes these moments miraculous is not just that something we can't explain happened, but that human and divine cooperate to accomplish something filled with love.

That's Xavier. That's all we ask. We want to be a place where we meet and cooperate with God to make love the rule, not the exception. We aspire to be the place where ordinary people can be a part of extraordinary, world changing moments. We hope that our young people leave their families and community blessed by their selfless leadership. If we could have only that, the consistent cooperation between each of us and God in our everyday decisions, we would be successful beyond measure.

Still, here's what I mentioned to our newest class this week – there wasn't anything particularly remarkable about the boy who supplied the loaves and the fishes. He wasn't a celebrity, a decorated athlete or performer, even necessarily the smartest or most well liked of his peer group. He was an ordinary young person with what probably felt like ordinary gifts. Still, he had an open heart and a generous spirit. Something tells me that the kid wasn't just carrying several loaves and fish because he was a big eater. That food probably was a meal for his family, his neighbors. Sharing it meant that he and others would probably have to go without. He was just a typical young person – probably insecure, unsure of where he fit in the world, sometimes happy and other times struggling. He didn't wake up that morning and say "they're going to remember me in 2000 years for what I do today." He just took his ordinary gifts, his regular self, and opened himself up to the message of Jesus. He let God work through him. The rest is history.

Let's pray that our young people find the power in being "ordinary." I hope that they can feel as valued as that young man did. We will be better off when each of our young people finds the courage to recognize that the gifts they have are given by God, meant to be shared, and transformed by grace. Your young person wakes up every day with the full weight of adolescence on their shoulders; they seldom believe that who they are in the ordinary moments could be good enough. Let's work together to change that. God made them, God loves them, and we love them. We love what makes them ordinary and even imperfect. We know that God can work through those quirks as long as our young people are open and cooperative.

At the end of the month, we celebrate Homecoming once again. Homecoming is never about what one person or one team accomplishes. It is a celebration of the millions of ordinary decisions and actions which make Xavier the place that it is. We have a lot to celebrate. Let's make it our goal to celebrate the simple, selfless, moral and thoughtful decisions that our students make each and every day.
