

Religious Education News:

Special Reminder: Parents, though we like to encourage our children to practice independence, please do not allow them to sign themselves into their religious ed. classes. We are experiencing children being signed into the wrong classes. In addition, there are legibility issues. Being responsible for your students while they are in class, we need an accurate representation of who is present. Thank you for your assistance!

RE Classes Meeting at 11:00 are:

PreK-K: Creating Home: Students begin exploring the idea of Unitarian Universalism as a spiritual home, while comparing it as metaphor, to the homes they live in. This week, they discover the word "threshold" as understanding a point of entering or leaving.

Gr. 1-2: Children are learning about the interconnected web of existence through a lesson about nature's partnerships. A story about partnership between sea anemones and clown fish demonstrates that helping one another is an aspect of interdependence and a cherished UU value.

Gr. 3-4: The Value of Questioning. Unitarian Universalism is a faith that considers each person's path of questioning and search for truth a key, ongoing part of growing in faith and deepening in religious understanding.

Gr. 5-6: What are the qualities of a justice maker? Students will discuss the quality of awareness as it relates to their ideas of justice. They will be challenged to consider how people create justice by working together.

Gr. 7-8: In grappling with UU theology, students evaluate the Ten Commandments, compose their own set of rules for ethical behavior, and discuss how cliques and groups influence the behavior of individuals.

Grade 9-12 meets 10:45-12:15.

Please sign-in by 10:45 and plan to attend the full class.

Topic: Fairness. What does it mean to you? Is fairness really possible? How is it achieved? Why is it a Unitarian Universalist value? Through accessing games, class will explore these questions and more.







We currently have over 100 Fifth Graders who are receiving books from us on a monthly basis. They are given these books to take home and keep, and we need all reading levels: picture books, easy readers and chapter books, fiction and non-fiction. **THE BOOK CLOSET IS BARE.**



RISC Update – 2018 Year in Review; 2019 Next Steps

2018 saw justice because of RISC's efforts. A few data points about the root level changes:

- Reading Mastery is being piloted in 8 Richmond Public Schools - the proven curriculum to get students reading to grade level.
- A Health Care Pipeline was launched by VCU Health – a proven pathway to in-demand healthcare employment for low income job seekers.
- Childhood Trauma Response Training was introduced into Chesterfield County Schools.

How did this happen? Who made it happen?

- Our 22 member congregations held 41 regional house meeting hearing 520 personal stories
- 318 Network members (leaders) committed to justice.
- Over 200 researchers, spokespersons, corporate visitors, carpool coordinators, floor team members, event speakers
- Putting in 6,414 volunteer hours speaking in a SINGLE voice seeking justice!
- And investing over \$42,000.

But enough about last year. What is RISC working on now (and maybe something for you to get involved in):

- The new issue is Housing. We are meeting with local experts and non-profits that work the housing arena in Richmond to determine the best practices solution that we want to pursue. Come join in. The meetings are interesting – and even exciting!

- We are continuing to research the most effective way to support RPS in their implementation of the Reading Mastery curriculum, continuing to develop ways to re-engage Henrico Schools, and make sure that Chesterfield School follow up on their commitment to train their entire staff and faculty on Trauma Informed Care best practices.
- Pursuing new congregations to join RISC (we have new ideas on this – do you have thoughts?).
- We will be doing LOCAL training on the Research to Action effort, the investment drive, corporate drive and other elements of how RISC works. Consider joining us.

Greene Team Liaison Needed



We are looking for a volunteer to join the Greene Team! We need a liaison to help with marketing VOCCA (Volunteers Organized for Cross-cultural Communication Assistance). Time requirement: 0-2 hrs/wk (depending on need)

This volunteer would advertise and promote the translation service to Greene School teachers and other staff.

VOCCA is a free translation service, to the teachers and other staff members at Greene Elementary. This is a low-demand opportunity to get involved at Greene, as this position is flexible and will require only 0-2hrs/wk (fluctuates according to need and the volunteer's availability).

Most of the duties associated with this position can be carried out remotely, with only 10% of the work estimated to require visits to First UU or to Greene. Spanish familiarity or fluency is not required for this position!

What is CARITAS? The letters stand for Congregations Around Richmond Involved

To Assure Shelter, and it is the largest emergency shelter program in our community.

We are fortunate to one last time be a host site. From Saturday, February 23 to Saturday, March 2, we will provide shelter for 10 to 15 homeless women in the lower level of our church. This involves the need for over 100 volunteers who provide breakfast, bag lunches, and dinner each day for our guests. In the past, our children have prepared toiletry kits, flowers for the tables, and candy for our guests' pillows. We need volunteers to spend the night along with the CARITAS staff and to provide special services such as financial/tax consultations, doing laundry, dentistry, clothing repair, haircuts, massages, manicures, and just hanging out and talking or playing cards. Entertainment such as music, movies, or magic shows are great additions. CARITAS can also always use towels, washcloths, tooth brushes, toothpaste, and other toiletry items; as well as pillow cases, sheets, blankets for their permanent building. We will be collecting monetary donations for staples and supplies. This service event is a great way to meet other UU members and friends, while providing a meaningful and needed service to our community.

We are seeking sheets (primarily twin-extra long, if possible, but all donations will be welcome), pillow cases, towels and face cloths.


Linens will be collected before and after both services every Sunday through February 10. Tables will be set up outside the Great Hall.
