



## INDOOR VISITATION ALLOWED IN NURSING HOMES: NATIONAL CMS & CDC GUIDANCE UPDATE\*

### CMS/CDC National Guidance

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), in accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), [issued new guidance for nursing homes to expand visitation](#) on March 10, 2021 (updated April 27, 2021). This guidance “supersedes and replaces previously issued guidance and recommendations regarding visitation.”

### Federal Requirements

“Facilities should [allow indoor visitation at all times](#) and for all residents regardless of vaccination status of resident, or visitor, unless certain limiting scenarios arise that would limit visitation” due to high risk of COVID-19 transmission.

### ONLY Certain Limiting Scenarios

- **Unvaccinated residents**, if the COVID-19 positivity rate is greater than 10% and less than 70% of residents in the facility are fully vaccinated;
- **Residents with confirmed COVID-19 infection**, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, until they have met the [criteria to discontinue Transmission-Based Precautions](#); or
- **Residents in quarantine**, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, until they have met the criteria for release from [quarantine](#).

### Compassionate Care Visits

“**Allowed at all times, regardless of a resident’s vaccination status**, the county’s COVID-19 positivity rate, or an outbreak.” These visits include:

- Visits for a resident whose health has sharply declined;
- Visits for a resident who is experiencing significant changes in circumstances, such as grieving a recent death of a loved one.

### IF COVID-19 Outbreak

**In the event of an outbreak** (defined as one new case of COVID-19 among residents or staff), the facility should suspend visitation and implement facility-wide COVID-19 testing.

**If testing reveals no additional cases in other areas/units of the facility:**

- **Visitation can resume in those COVID-free areas/units**, but remains suspended in the affected area/unit until that area/unit meets the [criteria to discontinue outbreak testing](#) (no new cases among staff or residents for at least 14 days since the most recent positive test).

**If the testing reveals one or more additional case in other areas/units:**

- **All visitation for all residents** (vaccinated or unvaccinated) **should be suspended** until the facility meets the [criteria to discontinue outbreak testing](#) explained above.
