As always, using musical repertoire as our guide, students explored big ideas: the importance of seeing beyond the surface; the meaning of multiple perspectives; and the value of developing "expert noticer" skills all while creating high quality virtual and hybrid performances. This season, while difficult in many ways, allowed us to explore life more deeply through music and grow an even deeper appreciation for the experience of live performance, which is greatly missed.

Thanks to caring individuals like you, GMYS provides a unique environment for learning and expression. For 63 years the explorations of GMYS have led to both musical excellence and new discoveries beyond the concert experience. Since the pandemic began, we have accomplished so much. It began with our Virtual Night Out experience in April, the Facebook Music Festival in May and a virtual summer camp packed with music learning, virtual field trips, fitness, literacy, master classes, and student collaboration opportunities with students across the United States and the world – all culminating in an end of summer showcase at a local drive-in movie theater.

This fall the excitement continued. We began to transition rehearsals back to in-person small groups and the magic of making music together once again brought us to life. In November, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) broadcasted GMYS's collaborative virtual performance of "America the Beautiful" during the historic launch of an Earth-observing satellite, which will closely monitor sea level and provide atmospheric data to support weather forecasting and climate models. We are ending the year with three Holiday performances sure to excite performers and audiences alike. Look for the Winter Festival, a hybrid event on December 12th; Night of Lights, an in-person event on December 19th; and a dual language virtual storytime of "'Twas the Night Before Christmas" on December 23rd.
