Registration Information:

Delegate certification and registration will be completed at the same time *by the congregation* for Council 2022, using the link sent to clergy and church offices via email in January. For assistance, contact council@dwtx.org.

Registration will not be required for any non-voting Council participants, such as clergy spouses and visitors. All members of the Diocese who are not clergy or lay delegates are invited to participate in Council 2022's live broadcast on the diocesan <u>Facebook</u>, <u>Vimeo</u>, and website, at <u>dwtx.org/council</u>.

*Replacing Lay Delegates with Certified Alternates:

At 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 24, an email with the Simply Voting link and individual Election ID will be sent to each certified clergy and lay delegate. If a delegate cannot be present, an alternate may replace them **only** during the following times:

Before 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Thursday, Feb. 24: The change will take effect when Council convenes Friday, February 25.

After 12:01 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 24, until 4:00 p.m. Friday, Feb. 25: The change will take effect when Council reconvenes Saturday, February 26.

Email <u>council@dwtx.org</u> to replace a delegate with a certified alternate from their congregation, copying both the delegate and the alternate. Alternates and delegates may not rotate while Council is in session.



Virtual Council 2022 Electronic Voting Instructions

The diocesan office has selected the electronic voting platform Simply Voting. Simply Voting is a web-based online voting system that will help us manage our elections easily and securely. This platform is used in over 4,000 organizations. Our diocese used the Simply Voting platform for the electronic elections in Council 2021.

The voting will be administered by the diocesan staff with the audit, verification, and certification from the Exec. Director of the Episcopal Foundation and third party oversight by Simply Voting. Simply Voting takes secrecy of voting very seriously. It is impossible for election organizers (diocesan office) to determine what a particular voter has voted as the results are anonymous. Simply Voting will never use voter information for anything other than voting and will never share such information with third parties. Simply Voting's <u>privacy policy</u> and voting system have been independently certified by TRUSTe for compliance with their Privacy Certification and Trusted Cloud requirements.


What do you need to vote?

You need three things: an Internet connection, an email address, and a device you want to use for your email and connecting to the Internet (smart phone, IPad, Tablet, PC, laptop). All Clergy, Delegates, and Alternates have been certified and registered with an email address. The initial invitation with the access information to the voting platform will be sent to each certified and registered email address.

IMPORTANT NOTE: For the Pre-Council meeting, the Voting Email Link will be sent to all certified Clergy, Delegates and Alternates BUT during Virtual Council 2022 only certified Clergy and Delegates will receive the Voting Email Link. Delete this email after Pre-Council as the link will no longer work. All IDs and Passwords will be reset prior to Council.

Preparing for Voting

The initial email for the Voter link will be sent at <u>3pm on the day</u> <u>before Council (Thursday, February 24)</u>. This link will have your Elector ID and Password link for Council. This is <u>your</u> ID and Password and should NOT be forwarded or shared with anyone.



The email will appear to come from The Episcopal Diocese of West

Texas. Within the email, or when searching for the email you will use the email: vote@simplyvoting.com.

- 1. Open the email.
- 2. You will see two links, click on the <u>second link</u> which contains your unique Elector ID and Password inside the link.

3. Complete the ballot which was sent. This opens the webpage within your browser and prepares you for voting during Council.

Voting During Council

All ballots during Council will be announced by Bishop. You will NOT receive another email for any ballots during Council.

When Bishop Reed announces a ballot, you will go to the link within the email sent to you in the afternoon of Thursday, February 24. OR, if your browser is still open to the Voting application, simply click on "Home" at the top of the page. If the voting application "times out", just go to the email which was sent the day before Council and click the second link again.

Your ballot will appear under "Current ballots" and you will see "Vote Now – "title of ballot".



- 1. Click on the "Vote Now..." link.
- 2. Bishop will tell you the ballot and how many selections you will be making and the ballot will have the "up to" number at the top. You make your selection by clicking on the box next to the name. A checkmark will appear.



If you attempt to select more than allowed, you will get an error message.

You can adjust your ballot as you want until you "Confirm" your ballot or until Bishop closes the ballot.

3. Once you are satisfied with your selection(s), click on "Continue" at the bottom of the ballot.



4. To submit your ballot, you <u>must</u> "Confirm" your ballot. This screen will show your selection(s). And, you can choose to "Change" or "Confirm". Your ballot has not been completed until you "Confirm".



After you 'Confirm" your ballot, you will get a
 Success page for the ballot. And, it will take you
 to other ballots which you have voted on for
 Council. You can click on previous "Voting
 Receipts" to see your selections.

Voting Time Limit

Once Bishop Reed announces a ballot, you will have approximately five (5) minutes to complete the ballot. Bishop will announce that the ballot is closed, the ballot will be locked and no additional ballots can be completed.

Upon Bishop announcing a ballot, immediately go to the link / website and click on your ballot.

BUDGETS INTRODUCTION

For 2022 the budget is organized into two different budgets, the **Operating Budget** and the **Reaching Out Budget**, in order to tell more clearly the story of the Mission and Ministries of the Diocese.

The **OPERATING BUDGET** consists of six parts:

SUPPORT FOR THE EPISCOPATE.....

.....funds the travel of the bishops who fill important symbolic and functional roles and also the travel of Episcopal visitations made by retired bishops.

SUPPORT FOR THE ORDAINED MINISTRY.....

.....provides for the funding necessary to the development and maintenance of lay and ordained ministries.

SUPPORT FOR THE DIOCESAN OFFICES AT BISHOP JONES CENTER.....

.....provides for the daily operations and programs of the Diocese.

CONTINGENCY....

.....provides for personnel moves as needed and other expenses not appropriately accounted for in other parts of the budget.

SUPPORT FOR MINISTRY PROGRAMS SALARIES, ALLOWANCES & BENEFITS.....

.....provides funding for some salary and benefit costs for Operations. Reaching Out program salary and benefit costs are included with each department.

The **REACHING OUT BUDGET** consists of two major categories:

PROGRAM FOR MISSION AND OUTREACH.....

.....provides funding for work through Diocesan institutions and for ministries that touch people outside the Diocese and its congregations.

PROGRAM FOR SUPPORT OF CONGREGATIONS.....

.....provides funding for programs which serve as resources to all congregations and for the support of ordained ministry in mission congregations.

RESOLUTION 2022-1

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution and Canons Of the Diocese of West Texas Canon 1, Sections 6, 7, 11(f), 12, 13

RESOLVED, That Canon 1, The Diocesan Council, of the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of West Texas be amended to read:

Section 6. It shall be the duty of each church to submit a Certification and Registration for each voting member no later than 30 days prior to Council. At Council, each church will confirm at least one voting member present to the Secretary of the Diocese, in a process determined by the Bishop's office. Such confirmations shall be used by the Secretary and the members of the Committee on Credentials and Privileges in determining whether or not a quorum is present at the Council.

Section 7, paragraph 3. This certification will be completed in a process determined by the Bishop's office; whereby the Bishop's office and the Secretary of the Diocese will receive the information.

Section 12. There shall be a celebration of Holy Communion at each Council, when meeting in-person, at such time as designated by the Bishop in the official Council program.

And, furthermore the following will be removed:

Section 7, paragraph 4.

Section 11(f). "printed"

Section 13. "printed"

EXPLANATION: The purpose of amending Sections 6, 7, 11(f), 12, and 13 of Canon 1 is to eliminate older processes which were in place prior to electronic communications.

The original Canon 1, Sections 6, 7, 11(f), 12, and 13 and proposed changes are illustrated below:

Section 6. It shall be the duty of each <u>church to submit a Certification and Registration</u> for each voting member of the Council <u>no later than 30 days prior to Council. At Council, each church will confirm at least one voting member present</u> to execute a card of registration to be furnished by the Secretary (of the Diocese, in a process determined by the Bishop's office.) as soon as practicable upon his/her arrival at the place of meeting of the Council. Each such registration shall be delivered to the Secretary or an assistant. Such <u>confirmations</u> registrations shall be used by the Secretary and the members of the Committee on Credentials and Privileges in determining whether or not a quorum is present at the Council.

Section 7. The Secretary of the Diocese, at least 60 days before the annual meeting, shall furnish the clergy or lay person canonically in charge of each congregation entitled to delegates certificate forms to be used by such congregation in certifying its delegates to the Council, reading as follows:

This <u>certification</u> certificate shall <u>will</u> be completed in <u>a process determined by the Bishop's office</u>; whereby the Bishop's office and the Secretary of the Diocese will receive the information. triplicate and signed by the clergy or lay person in charge of the congregation.

Not less than 15 days before Council, a copy thereof shall be sent to each of the following: the Secretary of the Diocese, the Bishop, and the rector of the parish in which the Council will meet.

Section 11(f). The report of the Diocesan Nominating Committee shall include a brief identification of each person nominated and shall be submitted to the Bishop in time for inclusion in the packet of reports to the Council printed prior to the convening of the Council.

Section 12. There shall be a celebration of the Holy Communion at each Council, when meeting in-person, at such time as designated by the Bishop in the official Council program.

Section 13. The order of business of the annual Council shall be stipulated in a printed program, prepared for Council distribution under the direction of the Bishop. It shall be subject to such minor emendations as the presiding officer, with the Council's approval, shall deem expedient. It shall include:

- (a) All pertinent matters indicated in Article 2, Section 3 of the Constitution.
- (b) Presentation by title, for Journal publication in full, of the annual reports of the bishops.
- (c) Presentation, for Journal publication, of the annual report of each officer, board of trustees or directors and other agents or agencies of the Diocese created by the Council. Such reports may be presented in abbreviated form.
- (d) The hearing of the reports, at the Bishop's discretion, of such special diocesan committees as shall have been appointed.
- (e) Action upon the reports of regularly appointed Council committees.

RESOLUTION 2022-2

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution and Canons Of the Diocese of West Texas Canon 9, Section 3

RESOLVED, That Canon 9, Sundry Boards, Committees and Representatives, of the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of West Texas be amended to remove:

Section 3. At each Annual Council, upon nomination of the Ordinary, shall be elected the following:

- (a) Six representatives of the Texas Conference of Churches, no less than half of whom shall be lay persons.
- (b) One member of the Board of Trustees of the Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest, such members to be in the lay order if the Bishop elects to serve on the Seminary Board of Trustees, or in the opposite order from the designate of the Bishop if the Bishop elects not to serve on the Seminary Board of Trustees.

And, furthermore the following will be changed:

Section 4(a) and (b) will be moved to Section 3(a) and (b).

EXPLANATION: The Texas Conference of Churches disbanded in or about 2015. The Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest changed its governance structure many years ago, and the Bishop of West Texas has not had the authority to nominate, nor the Council to elect, members to the Board of Trustees since that time. This resolution seeks to bring Diocesan Canons in line with current reality.

The original Canon 9, Sections 3, 4 and proposed changes are illustrated below:

- Section 3. At each Annual Council, upon nomination of the Ordinary, shall be elected the following:
- (a) Six representatives of the Texas Conference of Churches, no less than half of whom shall be lay persons.
- (b) One member of the Board of Trustees of the Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest, such members to be in the lay order if the Bishop elects to serve on the Seminary Board of Trustees, or in the opposite order from the designate of the Bishop if the Bishop elects not to serve on the Seminary Board of Trustees.

Section 4. The Council shall elect, at the appropriate times, the following:

- (a) Deputies and alternate deputies to the General Convention of the Church shall be elected at the annual Council held in the year immediately preceding the meeting of the General Convention. Unless otherwise designated by the Canons of the Church, the deputies shall be eight in number; namely, four priests, canonically and actually resident in the Diocese, and four lay communicants of the Church in the Diocese. Alternates shall be the same in number and qualifications. A deputy elect who may be unable to attend the General Convention, shall immediately resign as such deputy to the Bishop, who shall fill the vacancy by appointment of the alternate deputy of the same order who was highest in elective precedence. If none of the alternates so elected is able to serve, the Bishop may fill the vacancy. Should a vacancy occur during the session of the General Convention, the deputies present from the Diocese may fill the vacancy by electing one qualified to hold such office. In such a case notice of such substitution shall be given immediately to the Secretary of the House of Deputies.
- (b) Delegates and alternate delegates to the Synod of the Province of the Southwest, clerical and lay, in the number required by the provincial canons, shall be the same individuals elected as deputies and alternate deputies at Council for the meeting of General Convention.

RESOLUTION 2022-3

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution and Canons Of the Diocese of West Texas Canon 14, Sections 1, 2, 3

RESOLVED, That Canon 14, TMI – The Episcopal School of Texas, of the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of West Texas be amended as follows:

Title of Section. TMI Episcopal

Section 1. A corporation known as the Texas Military Institute of San Antonio, Texas, originally organized on April 25, 1935 under the laws of the State of Texas as a nonprofit, benevolent, charitable, educational and religious institution, is hereby recognized as an institution of the Diocese, for the purpose of developing Christian character and education.

Section 2. The management of the school and the responsibility for the financial and physical development shall be directed by a Board of Governors consisting of no more than 22 persons appointed for three-year terms by the Bishop and confirmed by the Diocesan Council. Governors may serve successive terms. The Governors shall elect a president from the Board membership. The Bishop shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Board with the power to vote. The school shall be operated on its own financial responsibility in accordance with its Charter and By-laws, the laws of the State of Texas and the Canons of the Diocese except that no real estate belonging to the said Corporation shall be alienated or encumbered without the approval of the Trustees of the Episcopal Church Corporation in West Texas.

Section 3. One member of the Board of Governors shall be elected annually by the Council from those nominated by the Diocesan Nominating Committee and/or others nominated from the Council Floor. Nominees may be clergy or lay communicants of the Diocese. The elected member will serve as described in Section 2 and will function as a full member of the Board of Governors being subject to the TMI Bylaws, which includes term limits. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the term by the Annual Council, but may be temporarily filled until that time by selection of the Bishop. Three positions within the Board of Governors will be designated for the elected Diocesan members.

No additional members will be elected for the Board of Trustees and the Board of Trustees will expire when the last term has been completed.

And, furthermore the following will be deleted:

Section 3(a), (b), and (c).

EXPLANATION: The TMI Board of Trustees was established as a non-governing board more than 25 years ago to support and advance the mission of our diocesan school across the Diocese. Members served primarily as good-will ambassadors. As the Board of Governors and school administration have expanded and developed, this work is now carried out by other committees responsible to the Governors and the school administration. The Trustees have not been a functioning board for more than a decade. This canonical change reflects the established practice of many years. Further, while the Bishop annually appoints members to the Board of Governors who are approved by Council, electing one member annually for a three-year term from those nominated, gives Council three seats within this important leadership and governing board for TMI, helping ensure a strong connection between the Diocese and TMI. The resolution is a collaborative effort of the Governors, Head of School, diocesan Chancellor, and Bishop.

The original Canon 14, Sections 1, 2, 3 and proposed changes are illustrated below:

TMI - The Episcopal School of Texas

Section 1. A corporation known as the Texas Military Institute of San Antonio, <u>Texas</u>, <u>originally</u> organized <u>on April 25</u>, <u>1935</u> under the laws of the State of Texas as a nonprofit, benevolent, charitable, educational and religious institution, is hereby recognized as an institution of the Diocese, for the purpose of developing Christian character and education.

Section 2. The management of the school and the responsibility for the financial and physical development shall be directed by a Board of Governors consisting of no more than 22 persons appointed for 3three-year terms by the Bishop and confirmed by the Diocesan Council. Governors may serve successive terms. The Governors shall elect a president from the Board membership. The Bishop shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Board with the power to vote. The school shall be operated on its own financial responsibility in accordance with its Charter and By-laws, the laws of the State of Texas and the Canons of the Diocese except that no real estate belonging to the said Corporation shall be alienated or encumbered without the approval of the Trustees of the Episcopal Church Corporation in West Texas.

Section 3. One member of the Board of Governors shall be elected annually by the Council from those nominated by the Diocesan Nominating Committee and/or others nominated from the Council Floor. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the term by the Annual Council, but may be temporarily filled until that time by selection of the Bishop. Three positions within the Board of Governors will be designated for the elected Diocesan members.

No additional members will be elected for the Board of Trustees and the Board of Trustees will expire when the last term has been completed.

- (a) There shall be a Board of Trustees of not more than eighteen persons, and, in addition, not more than six chartered Trustees. The Bishop shall be an ex-officio member and Chair of that Board. The majority of that Board shall be communicants of the Episcopal Church. The Board shall be informed of the affairs of the school, its needs and the challenges, and wherever possible strive to enhance the quality of education, spiritual life, and the overall quality of life at T.M.I. The Board shall be responsible for communicating the needs of the school to the Diocese and to gather resources in support of the school at the direction of the Board of Governors.
- (b) The members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected at the Annual Council of the Diocese of West Texas upon nomination by the Bishop, except two members of the Board shall be elected annually by the Council from those nominated by the Diocesan Nominating Committee and/or others nominated from the Council Floor. Nominees may be clergy or lay communicants of the Diocese. The term of office shall be three years, and one-third of the members shall be elected each year. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the term by the Annual Council, but may be temporarily filled until that time by the Board itself.
- (c) Charter Trustees shall be elected at the Council upon nomination by the Bishop and shall be chosen from the body of former Directors or Trustees. Charter Trustees shall serve for a term of one year and shall be eligible for re-election without interim.

Resolution 2022-4

118th Council to Convene Virtually

WHEREAS the worldwide pandemic of Covid-19 and the prolonged surge of the omicron variant continue to adversely affect the Diocese of West Texas in 2022; and

WHEREAS in consultation with the Standing Committee, diocesan staff and the St. Mark's (San Antonio) Council Host Committee, Bishop David Reed has concluded that it is in the best interest of the Diocese to conduct Council 2022 remotely; and

WHEREAS Bishop Reed seeks to minimize the number of people gathered together to protect the health and safety of the people and churches of the Diocese; and

WHEREAS Article II, Section 4, of the Constitution of the Diocese of West Texas provides that "for good cause the Ecclesiastical Authority may change the place or time, or both, of such scheduled meeting by giving thirty days written notice of such change to all clergy and all congregations entitled to representation therein," and such notice has been given on January 20, 2022; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the 118th Council of the Diocese of West Texas shall meet virtually, February 25-26, 2022, using such methods and processes as deemed reasonable by the Bishop; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that

- 1. The 118th Council hereby adopt such rules and methods as set forth in the Pre-Council meetings and such other minor adjustments as may be necessary for the operation of Council business.
- Council Eucharist (per Canon 1, Section 12) shall be suspended for this Council.
- 3. Voting shall occur by electronic platform, as explained and set forth in the Pre-Council meetings.
