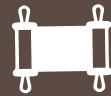

CHINUCH THOUGHTS

Rashi explains that originally the Avoda in the Mishkan was given to the B'chorim. However, after חטא העגל it was taken from them and given to Shevet Levi.

The above Posuk concludes that giving the Avoda to the לויים will prevent נגף - plague and misfortune from Bnei Yisroel. Why would giving the Avoda to Shevet Levi save us from plague?

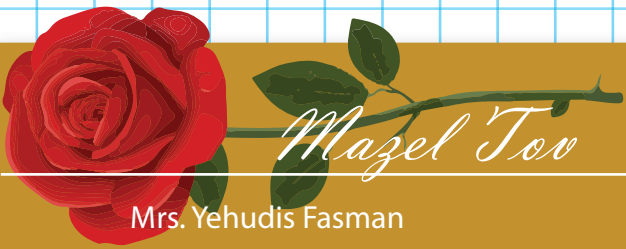
The Chizkuni answers that not every B'chor had a father or grandfather who was also a B'chor. If the בכורים would be the only ones doing the Avoda, a B'chor may not have a father or grandfather to teach him the correct way of doing it. That could result in mistakes leading to נגף.

However, giving the Avoda to Shevet Levi, meant that future generations of לויים would have fathers and grandfathers who would be capable of teaching and role modeling to their children the Darkei H'Avoda.

This Chizkuni emphasizes the importance of home based Chinuch. A B'chor could attend Yeshivas HaB'chorim specializing in Kodshim, where he could be taught all of the intricate details of Avoda. But without the home, his training would be incomplete and possibly lead to נגף.

During the past several months an unprecedented נגף forced all of our homes to become not only בית ישראל, but also בית הלוי. Parents took on the dual role of parent and teacher and by all accounts rose to the challenge resulting in a double ברכה of בית ישראל ברכו את ד' and בית הלוי ברכו את ד'.
