## CHINUCH THOUGHTS

Parsha Shmini almost always follows the Yom Tov of Pesach (with the exception of a leap year). One of the explanations given is based on the end of the Parsha that deals with the halachos of kashrus.

During Pesach there is a heightened sense of awareness as to the permissibility of certain foods. Every ingredient is carefully scrutinized to ensure that it is chometz free. Depending on minhagim these chumros include many stringencies that are really halachically permissible but kept because of the slight possibility of chometz, i.e. kitniyos, gebroks, etc.

After Pesach there is a tendency to heave a sigh of relief as we resume our daily routine. As a result, there might be a tendency to become lax in kashrus standards that apply not just to chometz but to every piece of food we put into our mouths. We therefore, immediately follow Pesach with Parshas Shmini to show that **מאכילות אסורות** include a lot more than not "mishing" on Pesach or not eating from food that fell on the floor. It involves the ingredients of every morsel that we eat in and out of the home all year.

Chazal say that eating **טמטום הלב** creates a blockage of our spiritual arteries that hampers our growth in ruchniyus. The Ramban and Sefer Hachinuch write that it is a cause of negative behaviors and character traits.

The Degel Machne Efrayim quotes a letter written by the Rambam to a community that questioned Tchiyas Hameisim. In that letter he writes that all **ספיקות באמונה** are a result of eating **מאכילות אסורות**, non-kosher food.

Rav Yaakov Kaminetsky, Z'tl is quoted as having said that one of the reasons America hasn't been able to produce Gedolim of the caliber of European Jewry, is because parents aren't careful with the kashrus level of the foods they give or allow their children to eat.

Pesach is a Yom Tov devoted to **הגדת לבך**, instilling our children with the **יסודות** of our Emunah. The Zohar refers to **מצה** as the food of Emunah. The Mitzva of Matzo helps condition us to be receptive to belief in our **יעיר אמונה**.

One of the challenges facing today's generation is the lack of **פשרה** that distinguished previous generations. Perhaps with a higher level of awareness as to the foods that we should or shouldn't eat, we can be Zoche to the Siyata Dishmaya needed to raise a Dor Yeshorim of Maaminim Bnei Maaminim.
