

## WWII Roundtable, Thursday, October 9th, 2025 at the DesertView theater

WWII Roundtable, Thursday, October 9, 2025 at the DesertView theater SaddleBrooke's WWII Roundtable welcomes you to our 2025-2026 season, with presentations that span a wide variety of topics: national & global politics, military science, and unique domains of conflict. Many of these issues and events still affect today's world situation. We are pleased to invite you to our opening session with Lee Baker, a retired army Warrant Officer from Southern California, as our speaker. We also ask you support in donating \$1 as you attend each session to help defray our cost of using the DesertView theater (which now totals \$60 for each use).

## The Historic Flight of Rudolf Hess

On the morning of May 10th, 1941, Rudolf Hess, the Deputy to Hitler, flew from southern Germany to Scotland to complete one of the most irrational and ill-planned strategic mistakes of WWII. In Lee Baker's own words, this represented a "bizarre and twisted historical event of World War II," with "several dark and peculiar possibilities that seem almost inconceivable, even for May of 1941."

After nearly three-years of unique and private access to high-level living German Leadership and secret archives, Lee Baker will present a first-hand account of the motivations, impacts and historical legacy of the peculiar life and death of Rudolf Hess. What did Hess intend to achieve? What was the impact of his defection and why it failed? Why did he select the City of Augsburg as his departure point, and why did he choose a contact in Scotland — the Duke of Hamilton?

Lee attended the 40th anniversary of the flight of Rudolf Hess in Augsburg in May, 1981, and met many important and historical personalities involved with the Hess event. This WWII Roundtable presentation will include one-of-a-kind photographs, documents, and details specific to the Historic Flight of Rudolf Hess.

#### About our guest speaker

Lee Baker is a retired Army Warrant Officer who served at the National Security Agency with 36 years consecutive service, 20 years on active duty and 16 years as a contractor. He served as an Intelligence Officer/Counter Terrorism Instructor with expertise as a Russian analyst, and special knowledge of Satellite Systems & Special Operations. Lee also served as a Joint Program Manager for several programs at the National Reconnaissance Office, the Defense Intelligence Agency and Central Intelligence Agency.

He holds a Bachelor of Science in International Studies from the University of the State of New York, Albany. Lee was a student and then Instructor at the National Cryptologic School – Advanced Cryptologic Course. He also attended the Joint Space Intelligence Operations Course and Special Operations Senior Intelligence Officers Course.

Lee was awarded the Legion of Merit by the United States Army, and had assignments in Washington D.C., Germany, England, Japan, Hawaii, Arizona, Colorado, & California. His wife Kathy is the niece of Larry Kraber, a long-time resident of SaddleBrooke. In 1983, Lee published a regional history book on the flight of Rudolf Hess, "Hitler, Hess and Augsburg."

#### WWII Roundtable, Thursday, November 13th, 2025 at the DesertView theater

SaddleBrooke's WWII Roundtable welcomes you to our second presentation of the 2025-26 season, with a topic that illustrates America's military superiority in the Pacific Theater. Bill Todd, a former Navy submariner in the nuclear age, will present the exploits of the Navy's "silent service" that helped assure victory against Japan. For the presentation, we ask your support in donating \$1 as you attend to help defray our cost of using the DesertView Theater (at \$60 for each use).

The US Navy submarine campaign against Japan had a profound effect on Japan's ability to make war -- by strangling its supply of oil and raw materials. Why was the US fleet-type submarine so much more effective than the German U-boats of WWI? What caused our submarine war to be ineffective for the first half of the war? Was it technical issues or human issues like leadership, training and personnel issues? Conversely, how did our program become devastatingly effective from 1943 to 1945? Why did America succeed in WWII undersea warfare when Germany and Japan failed?

Just as important, who were the standout sub commanders who led this daring charge -- men like Charlie Lockwood and the legendary Dudley "Mush" Morton. Morton's boat, the USS Wahoo, sank 19 Japanese ships, over several patrols and Morton earned four Navy Crosses...the last posthumously as Wahoo never returned from her patrol.

Bill Todd's presentation will illustrate how submarines work and explain the challenges of attacking enemy ships and sailing away as a survivor. Join us to learn about the war's most celebrated submarine commanders, and why they succeeded in a most lethal environment in America's "silent service."

Bill Todd has a business degree from the University of Chicago and served in the US Navy from 1962 until 1969, achieving the rank of Machinists Mate 1st Class (E6) when he left the Navy. He is a graduate of the U. S. Navy's Nuclear Power School and served as an instructor at the U. S. Navy Nuclear Power School. Bill qualified in submarines and served as the leading Engineering Laboratory Technician on the fleet ballistic missile submarine USS Daniel Boone SSB(N) 629 for five patrols, during which he was responsible for all radio chemical and chemical analyses on the power plant and radiation safety.

Following service in the Navy, Bill spent twenty years with Siemens Medical Systems and the rest of his career as a partner in a small software development company. Bill and Sheila moved to Sun Lakes, a Robson community in 1995 and to Saddlebrooke in 2009.
