As spring arrives, Senior Village is here to help you declutter responsibly. With the assistance of nearly 20 volunteers and e-waste partner Suburban Miners, Senior Village offers a one-stop chance to recycle hard-to-dispose-of items including electronics, batteries, computers/tablets, TVs, phones, paint, pesticides, fertilizers, house-cleaning chemicals, fluorescent lights and more. Any item that can be plugged in, is battery-powered, or contains metal may be recycled on March 29. However, certain items such as books, cardboard, clothing, furniture, mattresses and paper cannot be recycled here. For just \$20 per carload (with an additional \$10 fee for flat-panel TVs larger than 24" and \$20 for CRT, DLP and projection TVs), you can contribute to a cleaner, greener SaddleBrooke community. Let's work together towards a more sustainable future.
