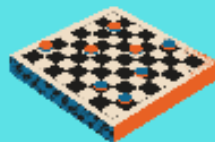

SaddleBrooke Community Outreach Scholarship Endowment Program

Each year SBCO applies a rigorous evaluation process to select students to receive scholarships of \$3,000 per year for four-year degrees and \$1,500 per year for two-year programs. SBCO established a Scholarship Endowment Fund Program to increase the funding available for these scholarships. Only the interest earned on donations is used to fund local scholarships. This allows donors to provide scholarship assistance to local students for generations to come. Donations to the Scholarship Fund can be made through estate plans or trusts, by donating a portion of an IRA retirement account, or by donating cash. Gifts of property such as real estate or cars is another option. The minimum donation is \$5,000. The SBCO Scholarship Endowment Fund is managed by the Community Foundation for Southern Arizona.

All checks must be made payable to Community Foundation for Southern Arizona (address 5049 E. Broadway, Suite 201, Tucson Arizona 85711) with "SBCO Scholarship Endowment" on the memo line.

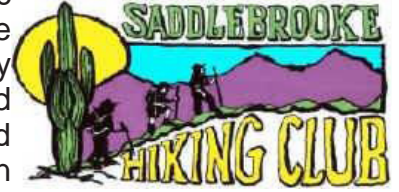

The **SaddleBrooke Hiking Club** has over five-hundred energetic, enthusiastic members whose passion is hiking the Sonoran Desert, grand canyons, gentle hills and magnificent mountains of Southern Arizona. This is a wonderfully diverse ecosystem. The club also gathers periodically for programs, picnics, and road cleanup days. Additionally, group fitness walks covering 3-4 miles around SaddleBrooke are led weekday mornings. Other activities include downtown Tucson, University of Arizona, and city of Florence walks, in addition to hiking trips to various Southwest areas (Arizona or neighboring states) once or twice a year with multiple hikes over several days.



However, the main activity and focus is hiking in Arizona. Hikes are led by member guides who choose from the club's database of almost 500 hikes or propose their own at guide meetings. 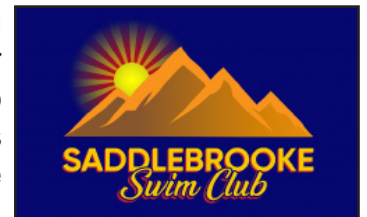

One of the many activities available to the residents of SaddleBrooke and Northwest Tucson is the Pathfinders Bowling League. This league has been around for over 33 years and is composed of both men and women, Active Adults, with ages ranging from the 40s to the 90s. This is a fully handicapped fun mixed league with bowling averages from the 70s to well over 200. Many of the bowlers come from SaddleBrooke, Sun City Vistoso, Tucson, Oro Valley and Marana. The League bowls every Monday morning from October to April. During the summer months we bowl individually for fun on Monday mornings. All bowling is done at the Fiesta Bowling lanes 501 W. River Rd located near the intersection of River and Oracle in Tucson with practice beginning at 10:10am every Monday morning.

There are 4 person teams composed of both men and women in the Fall/winter League but no teams for summer fun/open bowling. We had 20 teams this last season and have been as high as 30 teams before Covid. If you have bowled previously this is the time to bring back those great memories and fun. The lanes have rental shoes and loaner bowling balls or you can use your own equipment. Prices range from \$11 for 3 games in the summer to \$13 for 3 games during the Fall League season with a portion of the fees going for League, Team and individual bowler prizes. 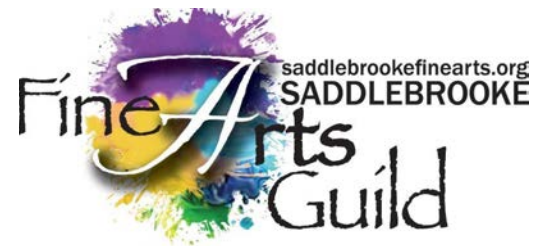

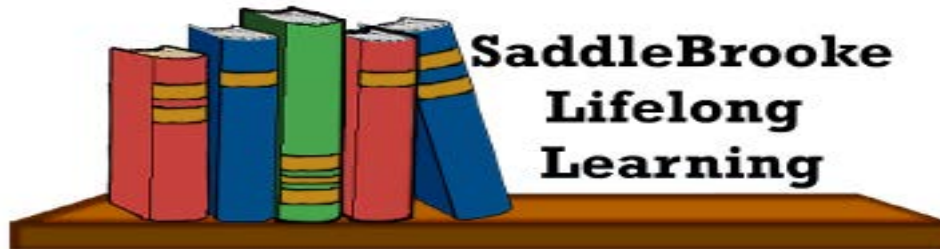

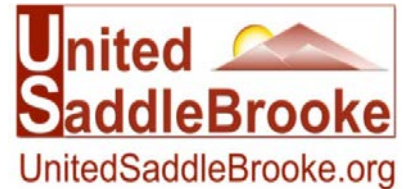

SaddleBrooke WWII Roundtable, April 16th
1:00pm at DesertView Theater
“The Science & Technology of the Manhattan Project, 1932-1945.”
Dr. Lockwood Carlson

Dr. Lockwood Carlson will document America’s project to develop and implement an atomic bomb during WWII — an almost impossible technical goal. It involved thousands of people but relied on the scientific expertise, engineering skills, and innovations of a select group of scientists and engineers put together at Los Alamos, NM over less than one year. How did they confront and overcome so many ‘show stoppers’? When the primary approach failed to meet the strategic needs of the armed forces, a whole new concept was developed, tested, scaled up and ‘weaponized’ in 3-4 years. This is the story of nuclear fission from the 1930s to August 1945 and the key participants as they raced to complete their mission — not knowing if they could reach their goal in time.

Lockwood Carlson holds a Theoretical Physics PhD from the University Wyoming and performed graduate research at Princeton University on electrodynamics of black holes in General Relativity. He retired from 3M Company in 2001 as Corporate Scientist with several patents in optical materials for digital displays.

Earlier, he was the Chief Scientist for major DoD program on advanced technology and held the Endowed Chair in Technological Leadership at the University of Minnesota for 12 years — on the faculty of the Management of Technology program.

He also teaches courses on cosmology, astrophysics, nanotechnology, quantum field theory, energy issues, artificial intelligence in medical science, and climate science at University of Arizona OLLI, University of Minnesota OLLI and Saddlebrooke Lifelong Learning Institute. Lockwood consults on advanced technology for Medtronic, Inc., and serves on the board of TSI Inc., a leading global nanotechnology company. He also consults on emerging technology in nuclear energy (small modular reactors) and renewable energy technologies.

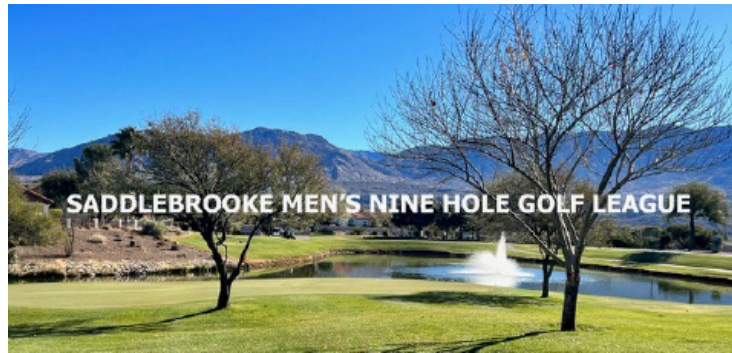
SaddleBrooke WWII Roundtable — Were we “railroaded” in WWII??

“American Railroads & Logistics in WWII, and the Southern Pacific Railroad” — Mark R. Schwartz (Lt Col, USAF, retired)

American entry into World War II came during a transition from economic depression to full-capacity manufacturing. Soldiers, raw materials and war goods transversed the country and moved to departure ports — mostly on US rails. Our Homefront production miracle would never have occurred if American railroads had failed to sustain the exceptional movement of people and materials. The Southern Pacific, in particular, rose to this need and merited close government attention as a critical segment in the wartime rail system. SP beat the expectations and serviced military and commercial transportation needs to help assure victory and America’s expansion to global superpower.

Mark Schwartz, a retired Air Force Lt Colonel and F-4 Phantom Weapons Systems Officer, lives in Tucson and lectures on military and political subjects — to include America’s rise to global power during and after World War II. He holds a bachelors degree in Political Science from Ohio State and a masters from Arizona State in History. Mark also belongs to a Tucson model railroad club and operates Southern Pacific equipment. His current focus is getting scholarly papers on politico-military subjects published along with an alternate history on World War II.

Associate Membership provides membership in the Arizona Golf Association, a Golf Handicap Index Number (GHIN) and handicap maintenance only. Associate Members are not permitted to play in SMGA golf events.

For the 2025 membership year, which began on October 1, 2024, the Arizona Golf Association will continue to offer members a standard rate of \$45 per year. For members of clubs that participate in the AGA's [Online Join & Renew Program](#), a \$5 discount is available for those electing to pay for their full-year, calendar and revolving memberships online. Multi-members will pay a \$15 AGA membership fee for each additional full-year club membership after rebate.

Please note, the early renewal discount offered in previous years for dues paid before January 1 is no longer available. This change will support our continued commitment to provide tournament management software for use by our member clubs.
