PPE Resources for Physician Practices

The Alameda-Contra Costa Medical Association (ACCMA) has compiled the following information to assist physicians with accessing the PPE necessary to safely operate their practices. Below you will find information about PPE vendors – if you know of any additional vendors, please feel free to add them to the spreadsheet of PPE vendors linked below. Also below is information about requesting PPE through your local government (county or city) and guidance on how to prolong the use of your existing PPE. 1. PPE Vendors

- Healthcare providers and healthcare facilities should initially attempt to order PPE through any known and previously-used supply channels or other commercial vendors.
- The ACCMA has compiled this [spreadsheet of PPE vendors](#) that reportedly have stock. Please help your colleagues by adding additional vendors with confirmed stock to the list.

2. Requesting PPE from Local Governments:

- If you are unable to obtain PPE through commercial vendors, place a request through local government Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs).
- For **Alameda County**, make a request through the EOC of the city where your practice is located (see list of City EOC phone numbers at the end of this document).
 - If the city EOC cannot assist you, a [resource request](#) can be submitted to Alameda County EMS.
 - The city of Berkeley has its own PPE procurement process: Contact info is HHCSDOC@cityofberkeley.info or (510) 981-5296; resource request form can be accessed [here](#).
- For **Contra Costa County**, there is no need to contact city EOCs first. You may submit a request directly through Contra Costa EMS.
 - Complete the [CCCHS Request Form](#), then submit to DOC.Logistics@cchealth.org

3. Prolonging PPE through Optimization Strategies

If you are unable to obtain sufficient PPE for normal operations, the CDC has published optimization strategies for PPE to offer a continuum of options for use when PPE supplies are stressed, running low, or absent. Contingency and then crisis capacity measures augment conventional capacity measures and are meant to be considered and implemented sequentially. As PPE availability returns to normal, healthcare facilities should promptly resume standard practices. Click [here](#) for more information.
