The ASPB and the conference committee invites you to submit an abstract with focus on our conference theme. Data obtained through our post conference surveys consistently maintain that our members are most interested in regulatory updates, wetland and fisheries topics, wildlife, and advancements in the field of biology. All biology and environment focused abstracts are welcome.

The deadline to submit abstracts is June 1, 2025. Abstracts should be between 250 and 500 words; please send them to the attention of Jessica Koehli at regulatory@aspb.ab.ca.

For your information, conference presentations will typically be 20 minutes long followed by a 10 minute question and answer period. Conference presentations will occur Thursday November 27 and Friday November 28. Workshops will be in a 2 hour time slot. Workshops will take place in the afternoon of Wednesday November 26. Posters can be displayed all 3 days and presenters will have a chance to speak to their poster on stage during a short, couple minute time slot. Speed talks will take place Thursday November 27.

The review of abstracts will take approximately 2 weeks beyond the deadline, and during the review period, the authors or presenters of potential abstracts will be contacted for a short online interview with ASPB staff or conference committee members.
