

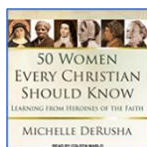

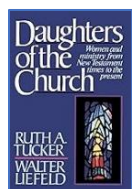

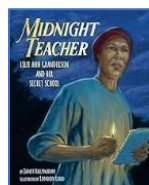

DAUGHTERS OF THE CHURCH: WOMEN AND MINISTRY FROM NEW TESTAMENT TIMES TO THE PRESENT (818061) Author: Tucker, Ruth A. and Liefeld, Walter. Published in 1987, this book provides a broad history of women in church history. Chapters: The Gospel and the world of Jesus - wives and mothers; Acts and epistles - prophesying daughters and silenced wives; The rise of the Church and the downfall of Rome - martyrs and sex objects; Medieval Catholicism - nuns, 'heretics,' and mystics; Reformation Protestantism - daring noblewomen and godly wives; Post-Reformation sectarianism - visionaries and 'she-preachers;' Trans-Atlantic reform and revivalism - social workers and lay evangelists; Foreign missions - jungle pioneers and urban church planters; The non-Western Church - lowly Bible women and renowned educators; Modern Pentecostalism and denominationalism - tent-toting evangelists and ordained ministers; The contemporary church faces the issues. MIDNIGHT TEACHER: LILLY ANN GRANDERSON AND HER SECRET SCHOOL (819145) Author: Halfmann, Janet. A full-color hardback book for children. In 19th century Mississippi, it was illegal for enslaved people to learn to read and write. But this did not stop Lilly Ann Granderson, an enslaved person who started a midnight school and taught hundreds of her peers to do so. Many shared their knowledge and others forged passes to escape to freedom. Based on a true story, this book is an inspiring testament to a little-known pioneer in education. Beginning her nursing training in a Methodist-founded hospital in Jacksonville, Florida in 1937, the author tells the story of her career. Chapters: Home missions; How Brewster came to be; Admission to nursing school; The morning after admission; The first three years; Graduation; United States Army Nurse Corps; Military and foreign duty; Back to civilian life; Dayton, Ohio; Return to Brewster; A historical look at some home mission work.
