INVITATION: A BIBLE STUDY TO BEGIN WITH – REVISED EDITION (109069) Author: Russell, Brian. What is the Bible's message? How does it all fit together? In what ways does it speak to women and man hungry for truth in the 21st century? In this 10 session DVD study. Dr. Brian D. Bussell


women and men hungry for truth in the 21st century? In this 10-session DVD study, Dr. Brian D. Russell serves as your guide through the narrative of Scripture: Creation, the Fall of Humanity, the Calling of Israel, the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Sending of the Church, and New Creation. Through ten chapters divided into five daily readings, this study covers the core content of the Bible with an emphasis on God's mission and the role of God's people in living as a holy community for the sake of the world. The goal is not merely information - it seeks the transformation of readers as they encounter

the good news of Scripture and realign themselves continually with its powerful truth. Sessions: 1) Realigning with God – Jesus proclaims the Kingdom (27 min.); 2) Creation and the mission of God (31 min.); 3) Paradise lost (29 min.); 4) Israel as God's new humanity for the world (29 min.); 5) Exodus, liberation, and the mission of God (29 min.); 6) God's holy vision for His missional people (28 min.); 7) Israel's life in the land – the potential and pitfalls of living as God's missional people (33 min.); 8) The prophets – servants of faithfulness and proclaimers of God's future (27 min.); 9) Jesus, the Church, and God's mission (24 min.); 10) Church and new creation (26 min.). The study consists of daily assignments (found in the study book) and weekly group discussions during which you will view the week's DVD segment. 




communities. Units: Introduction to dementia-friendly worship; Voices of persons living with dementia;



The Civil War was about deciding who counted as one of us and what rights, privileges, and duties we would afford each other. It was not a foregone conclusion that America would denounce slavery as unconditionally wrong. Into this arena steps Asa Mahan. Asa Mahan was an abolitionist, college president, author, and clergyperson who advocated that there is intrinsic value in every human being, and that, for our country to honor its covenant with its citizens, all must actively engage differences peacefully with justice and hope. Using primary source material, Christopher Momany helps us rediscover the moral and philosophical waters of antebellum America from which Asa Mahan drew his religious convictions and crafted his moral principles. The author also shows how Mahan informed and interacted with leaders like Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln. Includes black
