What is Family Links?

Family Links is a coordinated community effort for families who have expressed an interest in receiving support. It is an initiative funded by the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families to assist parents and caregivers.

What's possible through the Family Links program?

Families are connected to programs and services that will help them set goals; identify their informal support networks; find ways to meet basic needs; and address other family challenges. Community support could include parenting education, case management, direct services or referring families to other services when appropriate.

Families who have been screened out of child protective services.

Families who are receiving in-home safety services.

Pregnant and parenting youth in out-of-home care.

Families post-reunification.
