Medications to bring:

- Prescription medications, patches, and ointments
- Over-the-counter medications, patches, and ointments
- Non-aerosol medical sprays and vials
- Vitamins
- Pet medications


Medications not to bring:

- Illegal drugs
- Bio-hazardous material (containing a bodily fluid)
- Inhalers
- Aerosol cans
- Personal care products
- Household waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas)
- Sharps

Make sure to remove pills from their bottles or packaging
and place them in clear, plastic bags for easy drop-off.
