**Substance Abuse and Trauma** Substance abuse prevention specialists, youth workers, counselors, and AODA counselors will be exposed to the National Child Traumatic Stress Network research on trauma and substance abuse. Participants will learn more about prevention - based self - care strategies designed to reduce substance abuse.

**The Brain Architecture Game** This is a tabletop game experience that builds an understanding of the powerful role of experiences on early brain development. If your organization or community is embarking on a conversation about adverse childhood experiences, toxic stress, or other early childhood issues, The Brain Architecture Game can be a valuable resource for creating a common understanding and a common language on these topics.

**Building Prevention Programs** This training demonstrates how program structure, content design and facilitation delivery impact substance abuse prevention programs. Prevention program facilitators are encouraged to attend to share their techniques for engaging youth in prevention programs.

**Question, Persuade, Refer (QPR) Gatekeeper Training** The signs of crisis are all around us. How do you approach an adult who is showing signs that they want to die? You need to ask questions, persuade them to have a conversation, and refer them to professionals who can help. After this training you will be able to reduce suicidal behaviors and save lives by providing innovative, practical and, proven suicide prevention techniques.

**Mental Health First Aid** We provide both the Youth version and the Adult version of this training. The Youth version provides adults with tools to help assess youth 12-18 years old and the Adult version provides adults with tool to assist other adults who may be developing a mental health problem or experiencing a crisis. We recommend these opportunities to school staff, law enforcement, faith leaders, hospital and nursing home staff, sports coaches, after-school program staff, mentors, and parents and guardians.

**Mental Health First Aid Review Course** The MHFA review course is designed to reengage certified mental health first aiders with strategies for implementing the ALGEE action plan in diverse settings. Participants will strengthen their ability to engage youth, adults and elders in crisis situations and refer them to professional behavioral health services.
