



Global frameworks fail to support local decision-making without local evidence.





The current system tracks global commitments but fails to support day-to-day decision-making.

This blueprint aligns directly with the New Public Health Order.




Decolonizing Global Health: Dismantling unequal power structures to center African leadership.






We have a tight window to influence the global agenda.


