Message from the CEO & Board Chair

To all who share in this mission,

Dear Friends.

This past year has been transformative for World Pediatrics, with the incredible milestone of providing specialized care to 25,000 children in our 25-year history. These services represent more than \$250 million in care. Despite shifts in philanthropy this past year, we met or surpassed our goals. We now look ahead to serving more children in less time and with even greater impact.

World Pediatrics will celebrate its 25th anniversary during fiscal '26, formally launching on September 25, 2025, at a special United Nations General Assembly side event with the Prime Minister of St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

These 25 years represent more than clinical care. They symbolize the trust of families, the dedication of medical volunteers, and the generosity of those who believe every child deserves access to life-saving and life-changing healthcare.

As you see in our annual report, the impact of this past fiscal year tells its own story. More than 3,400 children received specialized care across 23 countries, with over 1,300 surgeries and 6,600 medical services delivered. We mobilized 88 traveling teams, extending specialty care to children who might otherwise have gone without. Nearly 2,600 medical professionals were trained, completing over 31,000 hours of instruction. Health systems were strengthened through hospital partnerships to increase capacity and ensure knowledge takes root where it is needed most. We also invested in building a stronger future by expanding local and regional capacity. This allows us to reallocate resources and teams to new areas of need. Fundraising is also growing at the regional level through community engagement and agreements with government agencies. This approach deepens local ownership and expands opportunities for growth.

We are creating stronger foundations for sustainable pediatric health systems. In the U.S., we are expanding momentum in Atlanta, GA and the Triangle, NC. Guatemala and Honduras continue to grow their reach, while in the Eastern Caribbean, partnerships with the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States and new institutional collaborations strengthen our presence.

Our financial health reflects the same commitment to strength and trust. With \$31.7 million in total revenue, including gifts in kind, and 88% directed to program services, we continue to steward every gift with care. This is especially meaningful given the expenses related to the complexity of our work. Our financial resilience allows us to expand boldly while ensuring sustainability.

The start of fiscal '26 marks both our 25th anniversary and an inflection point. This is a moment to recognize and honor those who brought us here, celebrate the children and families we have served, and chart the future. Our goal remains to serve more children in less time and with greater impact. Guided by our values—Kids First, Equitable Access, Shoulder-to-Shoulder Partnership, Innovation, and Rooted in Community—we prepare for a new era of scale and impact, holding fast to the belief that to heal a child is to change the world.

The needs before us are immense, but the opportunities greater still. With the unity of our staff, partners, volunteers, and supporters, we will carry World Pediatrics into its next quarter century with determination, compassion, and unwavering focus on the children at the center of it all.

Aligned with our long-term strategy, we reduced international referrals and traveling teams while increasing the number of children served. This reflects our commitment to stronger in-country and regional healthcare capacity. These changes signal that true transformation is underway.

FY25 marked measurable progress and change. Each step brings us closer to a future where advanced pediatric care is not a privilege, but a guarantee.

Progress and Growth Across Metrics

World Pediatrics saw continued growth this year—serving **9% more children**, securing **28% more sponsorships**, and performing **18% more surgeries** than last year. These milestones reflect stronger in-country partnerships, expanding local capacity through the training of **13% more local medical professionals** and over **31.000 hours of instruction**.

Regional Development in Guatemala, Belize & Honduras

Rooted in Community. Driven by Partnership. Sustained by Local Investment. In FY25, World Pediatrics deepened its philanthropic presence across Latin America

Honduras: A Historic Step Toward Systemic Transformation

- \$250,000 Investment: A groundbreaking MOU to launch a national pediatric cardiac program—the largest strategic investment to date under our regional model.
- Philanthropic Partners: Supported by Fundación Nasser, Fundación María, Fundación Amigos del Hospital María, and the McKean Family Foundation.
- Systemic Impact: This co-investment shifts from episodic intervention to sustainable system-building.

Belize: Local Ownership Begins-First Fundraising Program Launched

- Inaugural Campaign: Belize launched its first in-country fundraising effort, building a culture of giving to directly benefit children.
- Major Gift: A \$250,000 four-year pledge from a Silent Partner will sustain programs and expand access to care.
- Strategic Goal: Part of a broader \$1 million, four-year vision reinforcing Belize's path toward financial independence in healthcare delivery.



Guatemala: Philanthropic Ambassadors Leading the Way

- Record Growth: Fundraising revenue tripled from \$52,000 in FY24 to \$155,000 in FY25, surpassing the annual goal by 30%.
- Ambassador Engagement: Driven by philanthropic ambassadors and local leaders.

REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Expanding Access to Specialized Care

- Deployed 46 surgical, diagnostic, and training teams, including 10 neonatal teams.
- Launched a pilot ophthalmology program in Grenada with the Ministry of Health, screening all Grade 1 students. Led by Dr. Donna Brown, the team completed evaluations, prepared for follow-up surgeries, and set a pathway for expanded services.

Strengthening Skills and Local Capacity

- Delivered 6 educational programs in neonatal care, cardiology, pulmonology, and ophthalmology.
- Conducted 5 telemedicine Upper Extremity Clinics across 5 islands, providing specialized evaluations for more than 100 children.

Building Sustainable Regional Networks

- Expanded hospital partnerships to support cross-border referrals, enabling 18 children to receive care in Barbados, Martinique, and the Cayman Islands.
- Strengthened donor relationships while engaging new supporters for future growth.



Meet Kahmya

At just two and a half, Kahmya from St. Vincent & the Grenadines is already showing remarkable determination. Born with spina bifida, she has faced mobility challenges since birth, yet her journey is defined by resilience and steady progress.

This year, Kahmya underwent heel cord lengthening surgery with Dr. J. Eric Gordon and was reunited with our visiting physical therapy team, who fitted her with a new wheelchair and stander. These tools are expanding her independence and giving her greater opportunities to move, explore, and grow stronger each day.

Meet Dominique

Dominique is a bright, joyful child on the autism spectrum whose smile lights up every room. During a recent occupational therapy session, he engaged enthusiastically while his mother received practical strategies to support his development at home.

A meaningful moment came when speech and language pathologist Wendi McMillan gave him noise-cancelling headphones—a simple gift helping him navigate daily life with greater comfort and confidence.

REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

New Teams Launched:

Four new teams addressed surgical gaps: Osteogenesis Imperfecta and urology teams to Honduras, a local orthopedic team in Honduras, and an orthopedic team to Belize.

Innovation in Complex Care Delivery:

- First OI orthopedic team in Honduras, complementing medication management for children with brittle bone disease.
- Introduced an interim Pediatric Cardiac Care Program with Fundación Nasser, Fundación María, Fundación Amigos del Hospital María, and the McKean Family Foundation after the country lost its only full-time cardiovascular surgeon.

Empowering Local Providers:

- Deployed nine local medical teams across three specialties in Honduras—fully managed by regional staff to strengthen sustainability.
- Trained 248 additional professionals, with participation in neonatal conferences in Honduras, the Dominican Republic, and Belize.

Improved Operational Efficiency:

Reached 200+ more children than FY24 while reducing expenses by \$209,000

Network Expansion:

Regional hospital partners grew to 32 institutions, with new supply partners helping close procurement gaps.



Meet Eduardo

For Eduardo, a 10-year-old from Honduras, severe aortic insufficiency defined much of his childhood. Diagnosed as an infant, he underwent his first catheterization at just two months old and for years depended on medication and regular visits to Hospital María's Pediatric Specialties unit.

After a two-year wait, Eduardo finally received the complex cardiac surgery he needed—transforming his future. Today, he looks forward to life without constant limitations. His mother, Mileni, shared: "For five years, we've traveled for his appointments. Now, we trust he won't need medication anymore."

Meet Stanly

Stanly, from Huehuetenango, Guatemala, was born with frontal encephalocele, a rare condition where brain tissue protrudes through the skull. In a country without a public pediatric hospital, children with serious conditions often face years-long waits for surgery.

Through World Pediatrics and a partnership with the World Craniofacial Foundation, Stanly received complex surgery in Bogotá, Colombia. Today, he's home recovering—surrounded by his parents and little brother, ready to grow, play, and thrive.



United States Region

In the U.S. Region, World Pediatrics provides specialized surgical care for children whose complex conditions cannot be treated at home. Through a network of partner hospitals and surgeons, patients are connected to care and supported throughout their journey.









REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

- **U.S. Hospital Network Expansion:** Welcomed Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, Ohio, to our partner network.
- Volunteer Support: Non-medical volunteers contributed more than 100 hours each month, providing vital practical and social support to families during their time in the U.S. sylvania
- Powerful Partnerships: With the support of key funding partners and individual donors,
 World Pediatrics provided transformational care to 64 children this year.









Meet Malik

Twelve-year-old Malik from St. Lucia was struck by a trailer tire after jumping from a moving vehicle, leaving him with a fractured pelvis, broken femur, and ruptured bladder.

After initial surgery at home, he traveled to St. Louis Children's Hospital, where Dr. Douglas Coplen performed a complex procedure to reconnect his bladder and urethra.

Remarkably, just days before surgery, he competed in his school's track and field event —earning gold and silver medals. His resilience and determination embody the strength and hope that inspire us every day.

Meet Elisabet

Elisabet, a 12-year-old from Honduras, was born with brittle bone disease, a rare condition that has caused 64 fractures. Despite this, she faces each challenge with resilience and creativity.

During treatment in Philadelphia, the Ronald McDonald House became a haven where she could laugh, play, and simply be a kid.

Featured on our podcast, she shared her love of art, dream of becoming a graphic designer, and how support from her family and World Pediatrics gives her strength.

Elisabet's mom, Fanny, is one of World Pediatrics Honduras' reps and she uses her own inspiration to help other children.





Global Sponsorship Program

GROWTH OF GLOBAL SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMS

In FY25, World Pediatrics advanced the regionalization of its programs, aligning with local health systems to expand efficiency and reach. Children received care in five countries: orthopedic, general surgery, and cleft care in Haiti; orthopedic and cardiac surgery in India; general surgery in Sierra Leone; cardiac surgery in Uganda; and orthopedic and general surgery in Vietnam.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: VIETNAM

- Collaboration with Children's Hospital 1 in Ho Chi Minh City, with medical partners from Taiwan, Boston Children's Hospital, Nationwide Children's Hospital, and Texas Children's Hospital, to provide colorectal and pelvic malformation care and training.
- Year-round inter-regional training collaboration between physician partners in Taiwan and Vietnam to increase surgical training and skill.
- Hosted regional conference in Ho Chi Minh City with emphasis on bowel management techniques for over 80 attendees from 5 countries in the region.

Regional Collaboration in Perinatal Health:

Co-hosted the 2nd Eastern Caribbean Perinatal Health Conference with PAHO and Rotary, engaging 175+ participants. The event united clinicians, government officials, and hospital leaders to strengthen regional perinatal collaboration.



Capacity Building Through Training

- Renewed training agreement with Queen Elizabeth Hospital, enabling six neonatal nurses to complete an eight-week clinical rotation.
- Delivered nationwide Essential Newborn Care training in Dominica—among the first full implementations of the new WHO/AAP curriculum.
- Reached 1,972 trainees through 1,889 hours of neonatal training across multiple countries and platforms.

Evidence of Impact:

Published first outcome data from St. Vincent and the Grenadines, showing a 32% reduction in neonatal mortality from 2014–2019 linked to improved neonatal care and training.

Innovation in Neonatal Diagnosis:


Introduced Butterfly Point-of-Care Ultrasound (POCUS) for rapid neonatal diagnosis in NICUs in Guatemala and Antiqua.






