

CONTINUED PLANNING FOR 2025-26 SCHOOL YEAR

During the last quarter of the school year, the district will be detailing our 2025-26 school year plans. A few months ago, Business Manager John Belter outlined that the district would have a structural deficit entering the 2025-26 school year. Changing the district's service level will address some of the structural deficits. One example is that next year, the district is planning for 61 PK-8 class sections compared to 64 in the current school year. Upon our return from break, there will be final planning to limit the projected structural deficit as much as possible without interfering with instructional services. As the state of Wisconsin develops its biennium budget, our district, along with nearly every district, needs greater support from the state to offset the rising costs of educating students to a high level. This is a pervasive topic that needs far greater than a few paragraphs to illustrate and detail out. However, as the budget process evolves, more information will be presented and shared this spring.

Finally, let me close out this newsletter article by saying thank you for the opportunity to serve our community's children. It is both our highest priority and privilege to do so!
