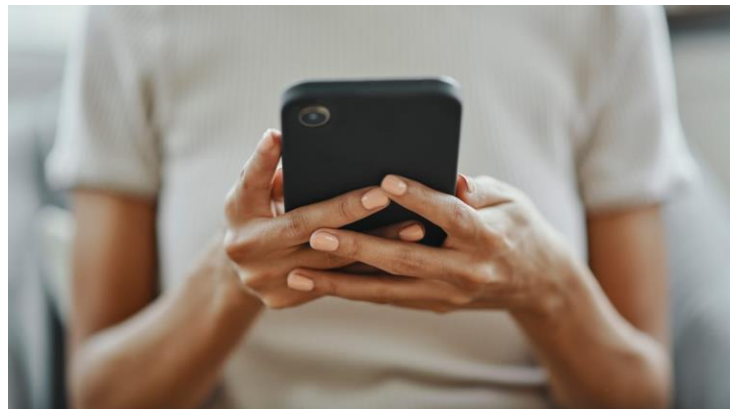


# The Impact of Cell Phones in Middle School: A Concern for Parents
