Irrigation renovation begins

ith many thanks to our public partner, the City of Buellton, for their support of our new irrigation renovations that are beginning soon. With our continued drought, we are very aware of water use in the Garden. With a system that is over ten years old, it is time to replace aging

and damaged equipment to ensure that our garden's irrigation is efficient and effective. The pre-construction work is wrapped up and renovation will begin shortly.

Please take this time to make sure your garden is 'water wise.' As the days grow shorter and cooler, check your irrigation clocks are adjusted and the systems are checked for leaks.


One 1 Gallon per hour emitter that is leaking can lose about 720 gallons of water a month. Think about taking the time to check your system the next time you pay your water bill.



On October 29th, Acorn Village Forest School presented Halloween Journey, an immersive theatre experience for children ages 2-8 years old.




