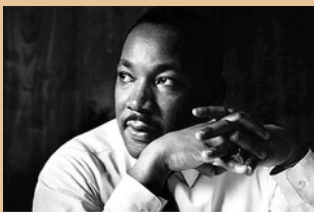

HIGHLIGHTS AND OPPORTUNITIES

A DAY ON THE JOB: DEVELOPMENTAL TRAINING (DT)

When asked how he would describe Developmental Training (DT) to someone who has never heard of it, DT Supervisor Sam B says, “DT is a wonderful place where residents from all over the Misericordia can come and participate in jobs, work on their goals, and enjoy new and meaningful [learning] experiences!” Under the Community Day Services (CDS) umbrella, Developmental Training (DT) is a Monday through Friday program that focuses on developing and enhancing daily adaptive living skills, economic self-sufficiency, vocation exploration, lifelong learning and enrichment, and self-advocacy with Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities. It supports 325 residents through 42 programs. Recently, Campus Connections spoke with DT about a day in the life there for instructors, support professionals, and management.

Anyone who has spent time at DT will tell you that no two days are alike! DT Direct Support Professional (DSP) Jasmine V says, “I like having a variety.” When she does her best to describe what a typical day entails, she says, “I go to different [workrooms] to help residents with their learning activities and projects they’re working on.” Residents look forward to seeing her and her fellow DT DSPs, like Hunter G, who describes feeling needed in multiple places throughout the workday, but says, “That’s what makes it fun!”

While the variation throughout the workweek helps keep DT exciting, it should not go without saying that the curricula and learning opportunities developed by instructors are what make it all around so meaningful.

Instructors are encouraged to bring their unique knowledge and interests into the direction of their programs. DT Instructors (DTI) Guy T and Brian H, for example, bring their interests in printing and graphic design, where residents have made art pieces for auction and t-shirts, coffee mugs, and other knickknacks to sell. In other areas of DT, residents focus on subjects like music education, geography, and computers and robotics. Recently, a few programs in particular have even worked with education and engineering students from nearby universities to design resources that can serve residents of every range of abilities. “I wish I had known how challenging it is to find accessible and adaptable resources for some of our residents,” says instructor Olivia N who strongly advocates for their enrichment needs and opportunities at Misericordia and the community-at-large. With the growth of DT, so have the programs and dedicated number of staff.

As we enter 2025, with expansions happening throughout the organization, Catherine H and Paul M, DT Directors, say they see DT continue to grow with Misericordia. “We will continue to have residents join us as they move into our community. We will continue to provide quality programming to our residents and grow our number of programs as needed to support the residents.”

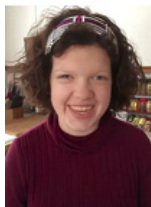

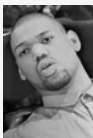
