Her 9th street home was always open to all neighborhood kids. When you left the house, you got a hug and a smile. She was a great conversationalist, loved books and would correct our speech - lie and lay. You lie down. You lay something down.

When we all left for college, she would call every Sunday and converse in her happy, curious manner and she was the glue for her Traynor family.

Rita’s co-pilot for 48 years, until going to heaven on his terms in 2005 was Dr. Mack. We could all hear him for the past few months saying “Hurry up Reets, I’ve been waiting for you to get up here.” They were both the definition of love your neighbor. We miss you, yet know heaven is a better place having you back together shining your positive light back down on all of us to be and do our best, always.
