Applicant must be a Candidate for Designation or a Practicing Affiliate of the Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute in good standing, working toward an MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, or AI-RRS designation.

Applicant must have attended a minimum of 2 Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute meetings within the past eighteen months. Please provide dates of the meetings. Please note that attendance at a continuing educational offering (i.e., State of Atlanta, half-day educational sessions prior to the meetings, etc.) is not considered attendance at a meeting.

Applicant must submit a list of completed Appraisal Institute courses and continuing education, to date.

Applicant must submit a resume or statement of qualifications. Please list most recent employment first.

Applicant must state if he/she is a previous scholarship recipient of this award.

Applicant is asked to list any Honors, Awards or Distinctions.

Applicant is asked to list any extracurricular activities and affiliations with other professional organizations.

Applicant is asked to list any volunteer or community service.

Applicant must submit a maximum 500 word written essay stating why he or she should be awarded the scholarship, highlighting professional goals and experience. In this essay, applicant should list educational plan for the MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, or AI-RRS designation. In lieu of an essay, two questions supplied by the Scholarship Committee may be answered. *Examples: Why do you want this scholarship? Please discuss your interest in residential or commercial real estate appraisal and your career objectives. Please include why you believe your interest and objectives make you uniquely qualified for this scholarship.*

Applicant must provide a letter of recommendation from current or previous employer.

Conditions - Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute Scholarship

Scholarships may be applied only to Appraisal Institute core courses that are offered by the Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute and that are provided to qualify an individual for the MAI or SRA designation. Scholarships may be applied to selected continuing education offerings approved by the Scholarship Committee. Scholarship money will be paid directly, and only to the course provider, Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute. Scholarship money is for course tuition fee, only. Scholarship award must be used within the 18 months following its award date.

Only one scholarship may be awarded to an individual in any one award period. There is a limit of two annual consecutive awards for any individual.

Award recipients must submit either a course registration or written correspondence to the Chapter Executive Director stating his/her intention to attend the course, no later than 30 days before the start date of the intended course, for approval of use for scholarship funds.

Deadline to submit the application is October 1, 2017. The scholarships will be awarded no more than 30 days later. Persons awarded the scholarship will be asked to attend a specified Chapter meeting for the formal presentation announcement.

A photograph of the Applicant may be requested for publicity and promotional uses in the Chapter newsletter or AI National correspondence.
