

TCA 2019 Legislative Issues

<u>Lien Law</u> - MODERNIZE the Texas construction lien laws. Replace the current confusing system with a simpler one of sending one notice at the beginning of a project, one fund-trapping notice when pay requests go unpaid, and provide an Internet website for project information and a place to post notices.

Local Employment Mandates

The State should preempt local ordinances that attempt to regulate employer/employee relationships by mandating things like paid time off.

Defective Plans and Specifications

- Remove the liability from the construction team for defects in construction design documents provided by the owner.

Notice and Right to Repair

A statute that provides for fair notice and time to repair will greatly reduce unnecessary lawsuits, but not prevent a lawsuit when a dispute over a construction defect cannot be otherwise resolved.

Securing Retainage

A construction team's retainage is essentially an unsecured loan to the project owner. This retainage loan should be protected so it will survive a foreclosure by the owner's bank.

<u>Statute of Repose</u> - Reducing the period of liability from 10 to 5 years will lower litigation and insurance costs, yet allow for a reasonable period of time for construction defects to be found.

LEGAL

Construction defect litigation typically is a result of the owner filing a suit or arbitration claim against a general contractor alleging certain things are wrong with the building. The general contractor, in turn, can sue all of their subcontractors, either in court or in arbitration. Sometimes the owner has experienced problems and seeks out an attorney for this purpose. Sometimes, lawyers who take on these types of cases seek out owners and help them discover defects. The owner and their lawyers typically invest large sums of money in hiring expert witnesses to inspect the buildings and prepare reports prior to a suit/arbitration being filed. By the time it is filed, it is unlikely they will resolve it without recovering substantial payment. These types of cases tend to be more common in Southern Texas, and sometimes Eastern Texas, where juries tend to be more likely to give high verdicts. These types of cases tend to be more common where the project was a school, condo, or medical facility.

The Owner's goal is to recover money, usually substantial sums of money. What drives these types of claims is the insurance money and coverage. There is no such thing as a perfect construction project. In addition, owners sometimes value engineer projects or otherwise want to "pay for a Chevy, but actually get a Cadillac" – Which is to say any owner, on any project, who looks hard enough will be able to find something wrong, especially 5-7 years after completion.

Often insurance companies step in to defend their subcontractors and pay claims, so there should be minimal out of pocket expenses for subcontractors, however: If the insurance company declines coverage, the subcontractor will have to pay for attorneys and settlement proceeds out of pocket, OR If the insurance company defends and settles the suit, the subcontractors insurance rates usually go up in the future.

ASA has had representatives from its board and/or its chapter counsel at various meetings with other industry players to participate in discussions about the best courses of action to prevent this type of litigation in the future. Additionally, ASA in conjunction with TCA (Texas Construction Association) is involved in supporting legislative bills that resolve this issue at a statewide level.
