

SCHOOL HOURS



- Armour campus school hours are 8:15a-3:15p.
- Doors will open at 7:55a.
- Dismissal begins at 3:15p (All students should be picked up by 3:45p).
- For late arrivals and early dismissals- parents, please stay in your car and call (only students allowed in the building)





ARRIVAL

- **Doors open at 7:55a**
- **Riders should enter via the Warwick side.**
- **Please be aware if it is crowded and hold kids in the car until it's safe**
- **Students should wear masks as they exit the car or bus**
- **Students will go directly to the cafeteria where breakfast is served.**
- **Breakfast sacks will be available for students eating at school.**
- **Students arriving after 8:15a are considered tardy and should check in at the front desk**





DISMISSAL

- The school day ends at 3:15p
- Bus riders will be dismissed from the classroom at 3:10p
- Walkers/Parent Pick-up will be dismissed from the classroom at 3:15p
- Parents picking up by car will enter on the Warwick side and exit on the McGee side.
- Parents are to remain in their vehicle when picking up students.





LOCKERS

- Students will use lockers to store coats, jackets, backpacks, books.
- Guidelines for locker use:
 - Remain at distance when using one's locker.
 - No locks allowed.
 - The notecard will be taped to the locker and include student's first and last name.

FOOD SERVICE

- Individually prepared breakfasts and lunches will be available from our food service provider for students whose parents want them to eat at school.
- Breakfast will be “grab and go” and eaten in the cafeteria.
- Students will be socially distanced in the cafeteria for meals.
- Milk and juice will also be available to purchase for students who bring their lunch.
- All students will wash hands before and after eating.
- Meals brought from home must comply with allergy concerns.

LEARNING MODEL

In Phase 2 of re-opening, HS students who choose in-person school will attend Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

- Students who chose online only will continue with remote learning.
- Wednesday will be remote learning for all students.
(Building is closed.)
- Attendance on assigned days is very important.
- Teachers will be teaching both their in-person kids and the virtual group at the same time (hybrid instruction).
- The schedule for the day will be very similar with the all virtual high school class schedule.





SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Classrooms will be arranged with students at their own desk, with a *minimum* of a 3-foot radius around each student, which grants 6 feet between all students.
- All desks will be facing the same direction.
- Windows should be open (weather permitting) as much as possible.
- Classroom doors should remain closed as much as possible.





SOCIAL DISTANCING, CONT.

- Each student will have their own supplies, not to be shared with any other students in the classroom.
- Students will keep personal items at their desk during the day to minimize their potential contact with other students.
- Due to increased risk of viral spread during aerobic activities, contact sports, singing, and playing woodwind-type instruments, Physical Education and Music classes will be held outside when the weather allows with each child having a minimum of a 6-foot radius of space, granting 12 feet between each student.
 - If it is not possible to hold class outside, alternate class activities that will not increase the risk of viral transmission will be chosen.





HIGH SCHOOL ORIENTATION


- Students will be reviewing protocols for all parts of the in-person experience during Musketeer time leading up to before November 5th.
- On the morning of November 5th, students will receive a tour of the HS to help them navigate their daily schedules.
- Students will start using assigned lockers at this time.





HEALTH & SAFETY

- All students and staff will wear masks in the building.
- Masks can be removed for eating/drinking during breakfast and lunch.
- Regular hand-washing breaks will occur throughout the day:
 - When entering the school
 - Before and after eating
 - After using the restroom
 - Any time hands are visibly soiled
 - Before boarding the bus
- Students will wipe their own desk and chair upon entering and leaving.
- Classrooms will be cleaned and disinfected each evening, and with electrostatic sprayers on Wednesday and Fridays





COVID 19 EXPOSURE & DIAGNOSIS

- Any exposure, diagnosis as a “presumed positive”, or positive COVID-19 test must be reported to the nurse immediately.
- If a student or staff member has been diagnosed with COVID-19, they must remain isolated at home for a minimum of 10 days and be fever and symptom-free for at least 24 hours prior to returning to school, *whichever is longer*.
- A physician's note may be required prior to allowing a return to work or school.





COVID 19 EXPOSURE & DIAGNOSIS

- Anyone who is returning to school or work after a required quarantine period must first contact the school nurse to confirm the ability to return to school.
- In the event of any COVID-19 cases in a building, the Health Department will be notified. The health department may offer guidance on the closure of classes, buildings, or the district.
- When a single case of COVID-19 has been identified, the affected student or staff's cohort and any other potentially exposed individuals will be notified. Académie Lafayette may exclude the exposed groups from school for up to the full quarantine period of 14 days from the last exposure.





DAILY SCREENINGS

- All Académie Lafayette staff members must complete a standardized self-assessment screening before reporting to work each morning.
- The staff member is not be permitted to work if they answer “YES” to any of the screening questions.
- Parents are asked to screen their student each morning before leaving the house and to keep students at home if they are showing symptoms.
- The school is relying on parents to make an informed & responsible assessment of their child’s state of wellness and ability to be safe around others.
- Please remind your student of the expectation that they follow all school guidelines relating to wearing masks, social distancing, handwashing, and handling of personal items.





MANAGING AN OUTBREAK

- KCHD will be notified by district liaison when a positive diagnosis occurs.
- The campus nurse will contact trace as appropriate.
- Close contacts will be notified by us and quarantined as ordered by KCHD.
- Cohort, grade level, building, and school will be notified by letter as prepared by legal counsel.
- Closures will be considered by administration on a case by case basis considering infection rates of cohorts, grades, buildings, and the entire school.
