

Policy IHAMB— Family Life Education
Regulation IHAMB-R — Family Life Education

The policy is better known as Instruction in Sex Education. This requires the district to do several things:

- Obtain signed, written consent from a student’s parent or guardian before any type of participation in the Sex Education Program or utilizing video, audio, or electronic materials that may be inappropriate for the age of the child.
- The school district may not provide this instruction to any students before grade five (5).
- The sex education curriculum must be made available to parents, both in person, and online.
- The district must notify parents, at least, two weeks, before any instruction is offered.
- School districts are required to include instruction on the laws relating to sexual conduct with a minor for students in grades seven (7) through twelve (12).
- Before a school district offers sex education instruction, the school district governing board shall review and approve the sex education course of study that is developed, adopted, revised, or updated.
- Alternative lessons shall be provided for students who do not enroll in elective sex education.
- Sex education lessons are taught to boys and girls separately.
- Lessons are ungraded and require no homework or tests.
- No lessons touch upon family life, morality, values or religion on the part of students or their parents.
- All content is age appropriate.
- Allows the district to provide instruction to kindergarten (K) through twelve (12) on immune deficiency syndrome and the human immunodeficiency virus.
