Mount Sinai West to relocate addiction treatment center

Mount Sinai West seeks to renovate a portion of the Winston building to relocate its current outpatient addiction treatment center along with its 23-bed inpatient addiction unit, according to an application filed with the state Department of Health.

The hospital wants to build out 4,585 square feet on the ninth floor of its building at 1000 10th Ave. for the new addiction center. The project is estimated to cost about \$2 million.

Currently the outpatient program is on 9G North, and the plan calls for it to move to 9G South in the newly renovated space. The inpatient unit is currently located on the eighth floor of the building.

The program has 44 certified chemical dependency beds, and 23 of them will be moved to the new space, according to the plan. The remaining 21 beds will remain on the eighth floor.

The renovations involve demolishing several walls to separate the inpatient unit from the outpatient unit, creating program spaces and building an activity and dining room for patients. The HVAC, electrical and plumbing systems also will be upgraded, according to the plan.

Construction is expected to take four months, according to the filing.

A representative for Mount Sinai could not be reached for comment.

Mount Sinai West is a 505-bed facility. It is part of Mount Sinai Health System, which has eight hospital campuses and over 410 ambulatory practice locations.
