### Principles of Bible Interpretation

Principles of Biblical Interpretation is designed to help students mine the Bible through thorough study, rather than simply pan it through surface reading. Another name for this course might be “How to Study and Understand the Bible.” This course will help the student understand the uniqueness of the Bible, its various types of literature that make up its pages, along with study methods that can help the student dig deep into the depths of the Bible to better understand its meaning and how it all fits together into one unified whole. The course will also look at how the Bible student can use the many tools (such as concordances, Bible dictionaries/encyclopedias, the many English versions of the Bible, original language helps, and more to help him or her to dig deep into the Bible’s message. Included in this course will be the learning of various principles that the Bible student will find helpful in his or her mining the Bible for the precious gems to be discovered within its depths.

### Professor Douglas Morton

Professor Douglas Morton is Assistant Professor of Biblical Theology at Christ’s College, The Institute of Lutheran Theology, Brookings, South Dakota. An ordained Lutheran minister, he served for 32 years as a parish pastor in congregations in Missouri & Iowa. Professor Morton has taught courses at the Institute of Lutheran Theology since 2009. He is co-author of the books *The Integrity and Accuracy of the Way’s Word* and *From “Vesper Chime” to “The Way International: The Founder, History and Activities of the Way Ministry*. He is published in *The Journal of Pastoral Practice* and *The Word at Work* magazine. A graduate of Wartburg College (1974) and Concordia Seminary (1979), he has also studied at Covenant Theological Seminary and the Institute of Lutheran Theology. He currently is a student in the Ph.D. program at the Institute of Lutheran Theology. Professor Morton and his wife live in Omaha, Nebraska.
