LAOH/AOH National Convention

The 2026 AOH/LAOH Biennial National Convention is scheduled to take place at the beautiful Hilton located in downtown Omaha, Nebraska from July 15-19, 2026. All events and meetings will take place at the Omaha Hilton and the Convention Center that is located directly across the street from the Hilton via a sky bridge. The hotel room rate is \$132.00 per night plus taxes effective July 11-19.

The Eppley airport is 3.4 miles away from the hotel. The Omaha Hilton has a complimentary shuttle service that runs to Eppley Airport every 30 minutes. This is a 24-hour service. There will be a 50% discount for overnight self-parking in the hotel's attached garage. Valet parking is also available. The hotel is in an excellent location with plenty of restaurant options, shopping, and entertainment.

Please note that the LAOH Constitutional Convention will be held prior to the opening of the National Convention. It is tentatively set for Tuesday and Wednesday, July 13 and 14, 2026.

Further details regarding the Constitutional Convention, National Convention, Degrees, website, hotel reservations, convention registration, journal ads, merchandise, etc. will be forthcoming soon. The local committee is working hard and promises that this will be a Convention to remember!

“Daughters of Erin” at the AOH National Convention held in Omaha, Nebraska in 1894. The women sought their own identity, and it was at this Convention that the AOH relented and allowed the formation of the “Daughters of Erin.” In 1906, their name was changed to the Ladies Auxiliary to the Ancient Order of Hibernians in America. In 1984, the ladies voted to change their name to the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians. The Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians was incorporated in 2004. At the Finals, some of our Pittsburgh and Cleveland members stopped in at the LAOH table. What a pleasure to meet Hibernian Sisters from around the Country. The LAOH were extremely proud to attend the Finals and cheer on the many Clubs from around the country. As a former member of the Cleveland Emerald Camogie Club, I am proud of all the Cleveland Teams participating but was extremely proud to see the Ladies win two National Championships in Football and Camogie. Three women participated in both Championships. What a remarkable achievement. I would like to highlight one of those women: Maureen Mohney.

The success of ladies participating in the Cleveland GAA is due to Maureen’s efforts. This is not the first Championship Team that Maureen was a part. She was a member of the Ladies Football Team when they won the Nationals in 2023. Maureen made Cleveland GAA history by being one of 3 that played on two National Championship Teams in the same year.

Maureen is not just a Champion on the pitch but in her involvement with the Cleveland Irish Community. This past May, the Irish Echo honored her as one of the Heroes of Irish America recognizing her involvement with the GAA, LAOH, West Side Irish American Club, Irish American Club and the United Irish Societies.

Since 2001, Maureen has been an active member of St. Pat- St. Jarlath’s GAA as a player and board member. Her dedication to the Club includes actively recruiting players along with promoting the GAA Community in Cleveland. She served as a Delegate representing the GAA on the St. Patrick’s Day Committee and in 2016 was appointed Deputy Director. As one of the Deputy Directors, Maureen has taken on the responsibilities of Secretary and managing the needs of the Parade committee ensuring the success of one of Cleveland’s most cherished traditions.
