Secretary:



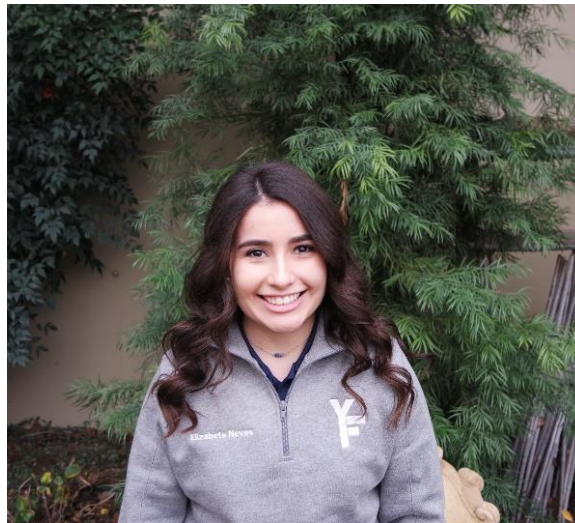
