Hotline Volunteer:

Consider becoming a hotline volunteer if you speak **English and Spanish**. Hotline volunteers are often the first human connection for people detained at Adelanto. Volunteers listen, gather basic information, and help connect people to resources and next steps. Training and ongoing support are provided—you're never doing this alone.
