## CHABURAH WITH JOSHUA MORIARTY

## THE DISPUTATION THAT WASN'T: MOSES MENDELSSOHN'S DEFENSE OF JUDAISM IN THE GERMAN ENLIGHTENMENT

January 10, following kiddush



Josh Moriarty our member and Harvard U PhD student will present a lecture and discussion regarding Moses Mendelssohn's response to a Swiss theologian's request that he convert to Christianity or engage in a disputation.

Moses Mendelssohn (1729-1786) was a singular figure in eighteenth century Germany. At a time when Jews were largely excluded from universities, he was a mostly self-taught prodigy who became one of the most prominent philosophers of the German Enlightenment. For many, he was the only visible Jew in "enlightened" intellectual circles. Because of this unique position, he was often held up as an example by defenders of religious toleration—living proof that Jews, too, were capable of wisdom and virtue. But he also posed a problem for many Germans: they

assumed that the "enlightenment" of Jews would inevitably lead to their conversion to Christianity, yet the unquestionably "enlightened" Mendelssohn didn't convert.

In 1769, a pastor publicly challenged Mendelssohn to either refute Christianity philosophically or convert to it. This class will focus on Mendelssohn's response, a refusal to engage in the proposed disputation. Through a close reading of Mendelssohn's brilliant letter, we will learn about the position of Jews and Judaism in the German Enlightenment; the connections between philosophy, religion, and politics in this period; and how to read authors who wrote in contexts of persecution and censorship.





## ANNUAL LUCY DAWIDOWICZ LECTURE

## WITH RABBI DANIEL NEVINS DON'T DELEGATE YOUR SOUL: PRESERVING HUMAN AUTONOMY IN THE AI ERA

Monday, January 26, 7:30 pm



Rabbi Danny Nevins, who recently published *Torah and Technology: Circuits, Cells, and the Sacred Path,* is dedicated to exploring the sacred realm of Torah and its intersection with contemporary ethics, culture, and technology. Ordained by the Jewish Theological Seminary, he also holds a MA in Jewish studies from JTS, and earned his bachelors in history from Harvard College. Jewish education is the centerpiece of his rabbinate, with a focus on training the head, heart and hands to engage with Jewish wisdom, create compassionate communities, and pursue justice.

Rabbi Nevins has led three Jewish organizations: Golda Och Academy as Head of School; The Jewish Theological

Seminary's Division of Religious Leadership as the Pearl Resnick Dean of the Rabbinical School; and Adat Shalom Synagogue in Farmington Hills, MI, serving first as Associate and then Senior Rabbi.

He has been a member of The Rabbinical Assembly's Committee on Jewish Law and Standards since 1999 and has also served on its Executive Council and Joint Placement Commission. He writes responsa on topics of contemporary halakhah, essays, prayers, and Torah commentaries, many of which can be viewed on this web site.

Jeremiah Lockwood is a scholar and musician, working in the fields of Jewish studies, performance studies and ethnomusicology. His work engages with issues arising from peering into the archive and imagining the power of "lost" forms of expression to articulate keenly felt needs in the present. Both his music performance and scholarship gravitate towards the Jewish liturgical music and Yiddish expressive culture of the early 20th

century and the reverberations of this cultural moment in present day artistic and religious communities. Jeremiah's research considers the work of cantors as arbiters of social, intellectual and aesthetic change in times of crisis and cultural transformation
