NOVEMBER 3RD ELECTION DAY

As November 3rd came and went, I am sure there were countless feelings across the board about this election. It was tough not to get bogged down from either side of the aisle on the Federal level. However, there were multiple Propositions cross Central Texas related to infrastructure. From Counties and Cities, many desires to be proactive in improving their infrastructure and proposed plans to help their constituents. Plans were prepared and presented to citizens for a vote, and many of them passed with a resounding agreement. The passing of the City of Austin's Alternative Transportation Bond and Project Connect to Pflugerville and Hays County Bonds Initiatives reinforces the encouraging view society holds on our work and its positive impacts on people's everyday lives.

LEGISLATIVE FLY IN APPLICATION

The 2021 Legislative Fly-In applications are Open! This is an outstanding opportunity to join and be proactive on the public policy process and a chance to interact directly with Capitol Hill staff. While this year's event is tentatively scheduled to occur at the Hyatt Regency Capitol Hill in Washington, DC, on March 3 & 4, 2021. We are monitoring CDC and D.C. Department of Public Health guidelines and will adjust plans accordingly. The 2021 Fly-In program includes:

- Meetings on the Hill with your Members of Congress or their staff
- Exclusive briefing sessions on key legislative activities in Congress and ASCE's legislative priorities.
- Interactive training on lobbying and influencing your elected leaders including pre-event webinars
- Networking with your ASCE peers from across the country
- A Younger Member Program designed to prepare you as an emerging leader
- Tips on continuing relationships with your elected officials once you return home



PROFESSIONAL MEETING, 11/19/20

This month we are offering a virtual Professional Meeting on Nov 19th. This meeting will feature Assistant Professor Cameron D. Murray, Ph.D. from the University of Arkansas. He will be discussing the latest advancements in the use of Belitic Calcium Sulfoaluminate (BCSA) cement as an alternative to portland cement in precast, prestressed concrete. It features rapid strength gain exceeding 4.000 psi in two hours, very low shrinkage and several durability benefits. Dr. Murray will trace the history of BCSA cement and include ongoing research at the University of Oklahoma and the University of Arkansas. Specific focus will be given to the feasibility of using BCSA cement in prestressed concrete members and flexural performance of members using it. Additional information will be provided in the upcoming SEI e-blast and at the <u>SEI website</u> where you can register.
