

MEETING TOPIC

DEVELOPING TXDOT'S IN-HOUSE LOAD TESTING CAPABILITIES

TxDOT has recently grown in-house load testing capabilities. This presentation will provide an overview of the implementation of recent research regarding load testing using high resolution digital image correlation. Additionally, this presentation will cover recent load testing efforts involving traditional instrumentation using strain gages as well as high resolution digital image correlation.

Istiaque Hasan works as a Bridge Preservation Engineer in the Bridge Division at the Texas Department of Transportation. Prior to joining TxDOT, he worked at a consultant firm as a Bridge Evaluation Engineer performing bridge inspection, load rating, load testing, non-destructive evaluation, and structural health monitoring. He is licensed as Professional Engineer in several states including Texas. He obtained his MS degree in civil engineering from Louisiana Tech University and PhD degree in structural engineering from University of Texas at Arlington.

Jesus Alvarez works as a Bridge Load Rating Engineer in the Bridge Division at the Texas Department of Transportation. In his time at TxDOT, he has performed bridge inspection, bridge design, load rating, and load testing. He is a licensed Professional Engineer in Texas and obtained his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from Texas Tech University.



ASCE HISTORY & HERITAGE

Howdy and Happy Women's History Month!

In 1987 Congress passed Public Law 100-9 – a joint resolution designating the month of March as Women's History Month. The following year and since then, each sitting US President has issued an annual proclamation emphasizing and recognizing the contributions of women to both history and society.

Prior to 1987, women in engineering were quite literally paving the way for future women:

- In 1950, the Society of Women Engineers (SWE) was established. Fifty (50) women met for the first national meeting that year. As of 2019, SWE has grown to over 40,500 members globally.
- During the 1940s women with degrees in mathematics and physics provided support on aircraft design and production during WWII.
- In 1938, Leah Moncure became Texas's first female licensed engineer. The first engineering degree in the state was awarded to Alma Giesecke Hodges in 1917.
- In 1876, the University of California Berkely awarded its first engineering bachelor's degree to Elizabeth Bragg. Bragg became the first female engineer in the United States.

From the 1800s when universities began to admit women to their colleges to present day society where approximately 34% of STEM occupations are held by women (Science and Engineering Indicators report, 2022) – we celebrate the women who tell our stories and we thank the past and present women who have lead us here.

2023 Austin Branch Engineer of the Year Award



Glenn A. Goldstein, PE, PMP, PMI-RMP, M.ASCE is a Senior Engineer at RS&H, a multi-disciplinary firm providing architectural, engineering and consulting services across the aerospace, aviation, health and science, and transportation sectors.

Glenn works as an owner's representative supporting transportation clients in the planning, procurement, and implementation of alternative delivery projects under design-build (DB) comprehensive development contracts. agreements (CDA), and public-private partnerships (P3). He provides risk management on projects across all delivery models and has helped facilitate over a dozen workshops and risk training sessions for various DOTs across the country.

Glenn began his ASCE journey as an undergraduate on the student steel bridge team and competed at the regional level for two years. Upon moving to Texas, Glenn joined the Austin Branch and became an active member serving in local leadership positions for ten years, including chair of several committees and board member. During his tenure as President, Glenn's focus on technical and community outreach saw a Branch resurgence in educational activities, including a successful Continuing Education Conference and many STEM outreach efforts. Today, Glenn remains engaged with the Branch and enjoys volunteering at community events and promoting the civil engineering profession.


