### UT VACCINE CLINIC NEEDS VOLUNTEERS!




UT Austin Vaccine Clinic has been doing a tremendous job with distributing vaccines and being one of the largest distribution sites in Austin. They need volunteers!





### **AUSTIN'S FIRST STONE ARCH BRIDGE** AT SHOAL CREEK

Being a part of History and Heritage committee, we are always in search of old monuments and historically significant structures in Austin and nearby areas.

For this month's newsletter. I am excited to write about one of the historical icons, the very first bridge known as West Sixth Street Bridge, located across Shoal creek.

The West Sixth Street Bridge (historically know as Pecan street bridge) is a historic stone arch bridge in downtown Austin, built in 1865 by United States Army. At first, it was a narrow iron foot bridge which could not carry the wagon load.

Due to increase in traffic demand, it was then reconstructed as permanent double-arch stone bridge in 1887. Today, the bridge still carries West Sixth Street across Shoal Creek and supports substantial pedestrian and vehicular daily traffic.

This bridge retains a high degree of integrity and is nominated to the National Register under Criterion C in the area of engineering, at the local level of significance, and an excellent example of a multiple-arch masonry bridge built with local material. The bridge also meets Criterion A in the area of Community Planning and Development as a structure that reflects the establishment of ambitiously wide arterial streets in the City of Austin in the mid-19th century, as well as the city's substantial investment in road infrastructure to encourage expansion beyond the original city plan.

The West Sixth Street Bridge is a closed spandrel deck arch bridge built of local limestone. It is 90 feet long and 80 feet wide. Its unusual width, reflecting that of Pecan street, was established by Edwin Waller's original 1839 Austin master plan. The bridge spans Shoal Creek with a series of three voussoir\* arches, each 24 feet wide at the base. Two central piers, each 4 feet thick, stand directly in creek bed on stone footing resting on bedrock. The stonework is of irregular shaped rusticated blocks, which rise to form a parapet along the bridge's south edge. It is believed that the bridge has gone through numerous repairs due to frequency and severity of flooding by Shoal creek without any significant alteration except the loss of northern parapet end.

Today the structure carries a concrete roadway surfaced in asphalt concrete, bearing four roadway lanes, along with parallel parking spaces and sidewalks on both sides. Indeed, the bridge is an excellent example of earlytwentieth-century urban planning in Texas's growing capital city and historic pride for Austin.

<sup>\*</sup> A voussoir (/vuˈswɑːr/) is a wedge-shaped element, typically a stone, which is used in building an arch or vault. Although each unit in an arch or vault is a voussoir, two units are of distinct functional importance: the keystone and the springer. The keystone is the centre stone or masonry unit at the apex of an arch. The springer is the lowest voussoir on each side, located where the curve of the arch springs from the vertical support.

The HSR bridge columns are innovative posttensioned precast concrete segmental columns with end rocking joint and intermediate sliding joints patterned after human limbs. The HSR Columns presentation will include basic concepts, response mechanisms simulation strategies and large-scale testing findings.
