As you will see in the following pages, our clients reach out to us while facing devastating legal problems which critically affect their lives. This hope comes from our very practical work of providing access to civil legal services.

Throughout the past year, Franklin County Legal Services has continued to provide free civil legal services to low-income people. We have continued to offer the services of two full-time attorneys to provide representation to people in need. We have continued to be officially recognized by the United States Department of Justice as a nonprofit agency providing immigration legal services to the indigent. We have also continued to coordinate the Franklin County Bar Association's Pro Bono Program. We work very hard every day to provide representation, advice, and education to the persons we serve.

Your support and involvement have made this work possible. From a mother facing a hearing where she could lose custody of her child, to a family being evicted, and to a young father in deportation proceedings, our work transforms despair to hope.

## Meeting basic needs through immigration law



#### **OUR WORK INCLUDED**

- Defending a child in immigration court.
- Keeping a family together through an approval of a Waiver which will help prevent years of separation across national borders.
- Defending an asylum seeker and her child in immigration court.
- Representing a US citizen in filing a petition for his wife so that she can adjust her immigration status enabling her to work, drive, have access to public benefits, and meet other basic human needs.
- Helping a homeless individual who was not born in the United States obtain proof of her US citizenship, a key to getting back on her feet.
- Working with an immigrant whose child had been a victim of a crime to petition for a visa based on her cooperation with law enforcement.
- Assisting a Chambersburg teenager change the venue of his court case from Houston, Texas to Philadelphia so that he would not be ordered deported in absentia.
- Filing a petition to unite a father with his teenage children and wife after years of separation.
- Welcoming a new US citizen though our representation in her naturalization case.
- Receiving Special Immigrant Juvenile Status based on a petition we filed for a child while she was in foster care.
- Winning Permanent Resident Status for a victim of domestic violence.
- Defending a single mother in immigration court based on the hardship it would cause her US citizen children if she were deported. We filed for employment authorization for her while her case is pending.

#### **OUR WORK INCLUDED**

- Obtaining court-ordered guardianship of two children after their mother passed away allowing their guardian to handle important matters such as enrolling the children in school and handling their medical needs.
- Helping a mother, who we had visited while she was incarcerated, re-gain custody of her children after her release from jail.
- Advocating for a father to have regular visits with his children.
- Assisting a mother obtain sole custody of her children after the father had abandoned them and was wanted by the police for over a decade.
- Obtaining a custody order for a guardian of an unaccompanied minor child from Central America.
- Successfully defending a mother in a custody trial and advocating for a fair family arrangement.
- Educating individuals about custody law and self-help legal materials to provide them with access to the court.
- Advocating for a father who had recently been released from jail and had been sued in custody court. We helped him establish a regular schedule where he could re-develop a relationship with his child.







# Ensuring stable and decent housing

### **OUR WORK INCLUDED**

- Defending a recipient of a mental health permanent supportive housing program voucher who was being evicted by a private landlord. The court case was dismissed, and the eviction will not appear on his record.
- Representing an elderly woman in an eviction from public housing.
   Negotiations prevented the case from going to court and the client stayed in her home.
- Saving a family from eviction based on our defense in court that the landlord had not followed the legal eviction procedure. The lawsuit filed by the landlord was dismissed and the family stayed in their home.
- Preventing an eviction through appealing a public housing decision and advocating for a client's special accommodations in the home based on a disability.
- Providing much-needed advice to a tenant fearing homelessness about the legal steps that a landlord must take to evict.
- Facilitating an orderly move for a couple being evicted. An agreement was reached that prevented a court judgment against the couple.
- Advocating for a family living with leaking sewage and a collapsed ceiling who had withheld rent and were being evicted. The repairs were made and the eviction prevented.



# Overcoming other crippling legal issues







#### **OUR WORK INCLUDED**

- Referring an elderly couple to a pro bono private attorney for the preparation of Wills, General Powers of Attorney and Healthcare Power of Attorney/Living wills.
- Visiting inmates at the Franklin County Jail to provide information and advice about civil rights issues.
- Referring a single mother to a pro bono divorce attorney for counsel and representation in important financial matters affecting her ability to provide for her children.
- Helping an individual save his mobile home he had lived in for decades through a referral to a pro bono bankruptcy attorney.
- Advocating for the return of a security deposit for a tenant who rightfully deserved it.
- Assisting an individual with a deed issue affecting her home where she had lived for over 50 years through a referral to a pro bono estate attorney.
- Helping a single mother obtain a Will and Guardianship Agreement regarding her child.














