MEETING BASIC NEEDS THROUGH IMMIGRATION LAW

OUR WORK INCLUDED:

- Assisting a refugee family re-settle through obtaining permanent residence.
- Representing a young man in obtaining work authorization and protection from deportation through DACA.
- Filing a petition for a child to protect him from having to return to an abusive and neglectful situation in Guatemala.
- Representing a battered woman in becoming a legal permanent resident.
- Defending a father in a deportation case so that his family can stay together.
- Obtaining employment authorization for a Haitian immigrant so that he can provide for his family.
- Helping a married couple stay together through filing a waiver so that the husband does not have to be separated from his family for years in another country.

PRESERVING MEANINGFUL FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS

OUR WORK INCLUDED:

- Helping a mother enforce a custody order so she could see her child.
- Obtaining a custody order for grandparents raising their grandchild which helped them enroll the child in activities, counseling, and medical appointments.
- Defending a mother who was sued for custody.
- Giving advice to a recently-single parent about how custody law works.
- Helping a father see his children.
- Educating, advising, and providing forms to an individual for self-representation in court.
- Stabilizing the home of an unaccompanied minor from Central America through a custody order.
- Helping a domestic violence victim maintain custody of her child while moving to another state to live near supportive relatives.

ENSURING STABLE AND DECENT HOUSING

OUR WORK INCLUDED:


- Restoring water and electric to a family after the landlord unjustly turned off their utilities to force them to move out suddenly.
- Defending a single mother after her landlord initiated eviction procedures against her because she would not sign an unreasonable update to her current lease.
- Giving advice to a tenant about how to move out before the lease term expired when her landlord was not making necessary repairs.
- Resolving a pending eviction of a family by negotiating with the landlord on their behalf.
- Getting an eviction case dismissed on behalf of an elderly couple after negotiations resolved the problem with the landlord.


OVERCOMING OTHER CRIPPLING LEGAL ISSUES

OUR WORK INCLUDED:


- Helping a client on a fixed-income get her security deposit back which was due to her.
- Referring a family to a pro bono attorney for help with name changes
 of their minor children whose names had severe clerical errors which
 needed to be fixed so the mistake would not cause problems for them
 later in life.
- •Helping an individual with bankruptcy who had lost all of his savings in a fire and whose creditors were threatening him.
- Referring someone to a pro bono attorney for the preparation of Power of Attorney, Will, and Living Will.
- Helping an individual obtain access to an attorney to defend her in a civil lawsuit after she was sued for her deceased relative's debt.
- Providing a referral for a victim of domestic violence to a pro bono divorce attorney to help her re-gain financial stability and freedom.


SERVICES WERE PROVIDED IN 581 MATTERS IN 2017
